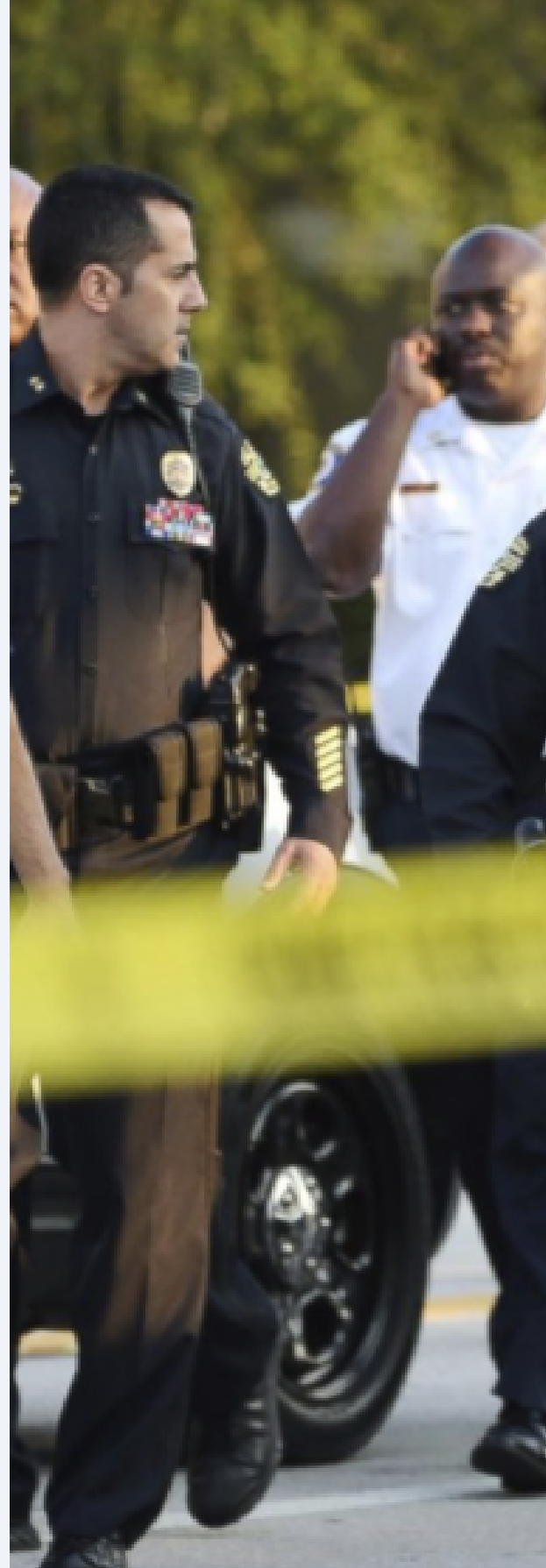
A Critical Incident Preparation & Response Leadership Training by the National Police Foundation
