Gage Adams, Attack, Kirkland, Washington, Senior, Binghamton

Adams broke through with his biggest performance of the season yet during Binghamton's 14-12 win against UMass Lowell on Friday in their America East Conference opener. The senior registered a season-high three goals and three assists, making it the first time this year that he posted either more than one goal or one assist in a game. With his three tallies, Adams passed Phil Cavallo for the fifth-most career goals in Binghamton men's lacrosse history at 67. Friday's performance was also Adams' 11th hat trick of his career with the Bearcats, which puts him one behind Michael Antinozzi's 12 for the third-most in program history.

Chris Kavanagh, Attack, Rockville Centre, New York, Senior, Notre Dame

Led the Irish attack with a seven-point performance off four goals and three assists in the victory over Michigan. His seven points helped him reach the 200-point milestone in his career, becoming just the fourth player in program history to reach the mark.

Aidan Maguire, SSDM, Hingham, Massachusetts, Junior, Duke

Scored the double over game-winner at Richmond and had four caused turnovers and 4 ground balls in win over Providence. Also had 3 ground balls and 1 caused turnover against Richmond

Dante Marinello, Defense, Watchung, New Jersey, Junior, UMBC

Recorded a career-high 5 CT's in UMBC's 10-7 win against Vermont. Also came up with 3 ground balls.

Mason Morel, Goalie, Atlanta, Georgia, Senior, Dartmouth

Incredible performance vs. Hobart, making 17 saves while allowing just five goals in a 17-5 win ... Stopped 11-of-12 shots sent his way in the second half alone ... Now owns a 59.9 save percentage on the season.

Brendan Powers, Attack, Skaneateles, New York, Junior, Delaware

Brendan Powers scored a career-high seven goals to go with two assists in the Blue Hens' 18-17 overtime loss to Towson.

Will Schaller, Defense, Bel Air, Maryland, Junior, Maryland

Held McCabe Million to no goals and just one point. Held Virginia to six goals for sixth game this season holding opponents to single-digits.

Aidan Shortley, Faceoff, Laytonsville, Maryland, Senior, Drexel

Won 21 of 25 face-offs in Drexel's CAA win vs. Monmouth. Also scored twice, his first multi-goal game, handed out an assist and had 17 ground balls, the most for a Drexel player in six years.

Levi Verch, Defense, Victoria, British Columbia, Canada, Senior, Saint Joseph's

Scored a goal and an assist in yet another dominant performance defensively...registered four caused turnovers for the third time this season in the 12-8 win over Villanova...added a team-high eight ground balls in the win over the Wildcats...has recorded 6+ ground balls in all seven games this season...third in NCAA in CTs per game and second among non-faceoff athletes in ground balls

Mikey Weisshaar, Attack, Arnold, Maryland, Junior, Towson

Scored six goals and an assist, including game-winning overtime goal, in victory vs. Delaware. Six goals is a career-high. Also caused two turnovers on the ride.
