

Hunter Aquino, Midfield, Easton, Pennsylvania, Freshman, Penn State

Aquino tallied a goal and four assists in Penn State's 13-12 overtime upset win over No. 3 Cornell, with the final two assists coming on the game-tying goal in regulation and the game-winning tally in overtime.

Ryan Doherty, Attack, Concord, New Hampshire, Sophomore, UAlbany

Ryan Doherty tied the UAlbany single game scoring record of nine goals previously held by lacrosse legends Lyle and Miles Thompson. He added one assist for a total of 10 points, as well as a ground ball in UAlbany's 17-12 win over Hobart. He added one goal, two assists, and three ground balls against #10 Georgetown earlier in the week.

John Carrabine, LSM, Lake Forest, Illinois, Sophomore, Colgate

Carrabine notched a career-high six caused turnovers and scooped up six ground balls in Colgate's 19-14 win at Lafayette which saw the Raiders outscore the Leopards 8-2 in the fourth quarter.

Ryan Croddick, Goalie, Rumson, New Jersey, Junior, Princeton

Croddick made 24 saves on 29 shots in Princeton's 11-5 victory over Rutgers, finishing with an 0.828 save percentage.

Thomas Goguen, Defense, Weston, Massachusetts, Junior, Dartmouth

In Dartmouth's wins over Siena and Utah, Goguen finished with eight groundballs and seven groundballs.

Sam King, Attack, Baltimore, Maryland, Senior, Harvard

King tallied six goals on eight shots, including the game winner, while adding five groundballs and two caused turnovers in Harvard's 14-11 victory over RV/No. 20 Michigan.

Timothy Shannehan, Attack, Fairfield, Connecticut, Freshman, Boston University

Shannehan collected a career-best nine points on four goals and a career-high five assists in Boston's 21-12 win against Bucknell.

Riley Sullivan, Attack, Roswell, Georgia, Senior, Lafayette

Sullivan totaled five goals on seven shots and added seven assists in Lafayette's loss to Colgate.

Bobby van Buren, Defense, Wingate, North Carolina, Senior, Ohio State

In Ohio State's 10-9 upset win against Notre Dame, Bobby van Buren limited Chris Kavanaugh to just two goals and four shots as the Buckeyes held the Fighting Irish to single digit goals for the first time since April of 2023.

Brady Wambach, Faceoff, Pittsford, New York, North Carolina

Brady Wambach went 20-of-23 (87-percent) on faceoffs for North Carolina in their 18-7 victory against Hofstra, his second straight outing with 20-plus faceoff wins.
