

Mason Cook, Attack, Towson, Md., Sophomore, Loyola Maryland

Cook scored eight goals at Colgate, including the final three of the game to turn an 11-10 deficit into a 13-11 victory. He is the first Loyola player since 2019 to score 8+ goals in a game.

Colman Craft, Defense, Pittsburgh, Pa., Freshman, Hobart

Craft recorded five caused turnovers at No. 3 Cornell, one off the Hobart game record, and helped his defense pitch a second-half shutout against Robert Morris thanks to two caused turnovers and three ground balls.

Ryan Croddick, Goalkeeper, Rumson, N.J., Senior, Princeton

Croddick made 39 saves and allowed just 16 goals in wins over No. 6 Syracuse and No. 1 North Carolina. Twenty-five of those stops came in an 11-9 win over UNC, which was the highest single-game save total by a Princeton goalie since 1985.

Tyler Fox, Midfield, Fairfield, Conn., Junior, Boston University

Running with the first-line midfield unit for the first time, Fox exploded for two goals and two assists without turning the ball over in the Terriers' 15-10 win over No. 20 Navy.

Vincent Gaylord, Faceoff, East Greenbush, N.Y., Freshman, Richmond

Gaylord went 10-of-16 at the X and added a game-leading five ground balls to help hold Cornell, which entered the contest as the nation's top faceoff team, to just a 39% success rate in the Spiders' 8-7 win.

Nate Kabiri, Attack, McLean, Va., Junior, Princeton

Kabiri had two goals and one assist in an 11-7 win over No. 6 Syracuse before totaling six points on three goals and three assists in an 11-9 win over No. 1 North Carolina.

Kai Lopez, Faceoff, Glen Mills, Pa., Sophomore, Towson

Lopez won a career-high 18 faceoffs, including 15 to himself (and two others via violation), and also dished out an assist in Towson's 14-10 win over UMBC.

Alex Ross, Defense, Davidsonville, Md., Senior, Penn State

Ross recovered a season-high four ground balls and matched his career high with three caused turnovers as Penn State held Yale to its second fewest goals scored this season at seven.

Joe Sheridan, Midfield, West Chester, Pa., Senior, Richmond

Three of Sheridan's game-high four points (2g, 2a) came on the last three goals of the contest, as he scored the game-tying goal and assisted on two more, including the go-ahead strike with 1:04 remaining to lift Richmond to an 8-7 win over Cornell.

Jack Speidell, Attack, East Setauket, N.Y., Junior, Harvard

Speidell logged a career-high nine points thanks in part to a career-high seven goals in the Crimson's 19-10 victory over Marquette.
