#### **Funding Announcement:**

We are excited to share that the NWTAC proposal for "Building resilience to wildfire in 29 communities in the Northwest Territories" was approved and announced. The federal government awarded nearly \$20 million (\$19,985,264) to the NWTAC, fully funding the creation of fire breaks and fuel reduction strategies to improve community protection from wildfires. This fund will also help build resilience in the face of increasing natural disasters. At the current rate, the program would have taken 83 years to complete, and our communities would have remained vulnerable. With this project, the work can be completed in 10 years, protecting our communities and providing socioeconomic benefits to communities across the North.
