



PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION
(outlined below)

PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION

Members of the SAIC Board of Directors have proposed the following amendment to Article VIII (A)(1) of the Constitution for consideration at the Annual Meeting of the Assembly. According to Article XI, the Constitution may be amended by a 3/4 affirmative vote of the present and voting members of SAIC as defined in Article IV.

Categories of membership as defined in Article IV are:

1. Groups such as legally established congregations meeting regularly for worship.
2. Groups such as denominational judicatories.
3. Groups such as religious bodies or religious organizations.

Each shall have met conditions for membership as set forth by the SAIC Board.
(Congregations may be members singly or through the membership of their judicatory body.)

ARTICLE VIII - OFFICERS (A)(1)

The President, the Vice-Presidents (with the exception of the Vice-President for Judicatories), the Secretary and the Treasurer shall be elected biennially by the Board of Directors from among its own membership. This shall take place at the Board meeting immediately following the annual meeting. The term of the President, Vice-Presidents, Secretary & Treasurer shall be for two (2) calendar years.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT

Resolved that Article VIII(A)(1) of the Constitution be amended by deleting the word "biennially" from the first sentence and by deleting the last sentence of that section and substituting the following: The term of the President, Vice-Presidents, and Treasurer shall be for one (1) calendar year with eligibility to serve for a second term, provided the officer will continue to be eligible to serve during that year as a member of the Board of Directors.
