Discerning and electing a Bishop will set our Synod on a trajectory for the next 6-12 years, and this is a major consideration for us. Much of what we do and how we participate with other ELCA congregations in Nebraska and across the globe will be determined by the leadership set forth by the Bishop. It is a big deal. The Assembly is in Kearney, NE, June 2-4, 2022. Please let a member of the Nominating Committee (Jean Hundtoft, Ryan Schroeter, Loren Havekost, or Tracy Gross) know of your interest.

Finally, the election of a Bishop is a chance to dream into the future. The COVID-19 pandemic has re-arranged how people behave. Perhaps that is why I was so captivated by the movie about Dickens the other night? No matter what the circumstances, going into the future kindness and generosity are the bedrock of a human being. Jesus of Nazareth did a lot of things as the Son of God, but none more important than becoming human and showing us how to be kind and generous. And that seems to me what Christmas is all about. Merry Christmas!!





Blessed to be a Blessing Stewardship Appeal Frequently Asked Ouestions

I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you, and make your name great, so that you will be a blessing." **Genesis. 12.2**

What is the Status of the debt on the LIFE Center loan? The original amount of the loan was \$2.28 million in 2005, and the congregation has steadily been paying \$12,755 a month to pay off the loan. Thanks to previous donors, the current balance due (\$400,000) it is to be paid off in the summer of 2024.

Why a Fund Appeal now? Our Stewardship Committee believes the balance is low enough that if our congregation can commit to 12-14 months of paying the balance we can enter 2023 debt-free! We have other building maintenance issues that need to be addressed and paying off this debt will free us to work on them.

When does "Blessed to be a Blessing" begin? Currently our committee is visiting with long-time donors to the LIFE Center project. The congregation at large will be encouraged to make a donation or pledge in December 2021 and January 2022. Pledges can be paid until the appeal closes on December 31, 2022.

How will I be able to participate? How much should I give? Initially people will be visited, and everyone sent an information packet with a giving/pledge card. The Committee hopes to visit with as many people as possible over the course of 2022 in order to encourage everyone to participate. You may give any amount, but on average if each person or family commits to giving \$20 more a week (\$1000 annually), we should be able to pay off the loan. This is a gift over and above your regular donations and contributions, as we want to continue to provide high quality ministry, and maintaining to support our many mission partners in their endeavors.

What will "Blessed to be a Blessing" look like? Because so much of our ministry is now on-line as well as in-person, we will be providing a wide variety of videos to highlight many of the blessings we help provide with our ministry partners. Our ministry partners work across the globe, and every person of First Lutheran provides support for them. Take this opportunity to learn about the blessings you have shared as a valuable member of our congregation. Thank you for all you have given and will give to the ministries of First Lutheran.
