NEWS FROM OUR PASTOR

"Summer days driftin' away, to, uh oh, those summer nights ..."

(Summer Lovin', from the musical <u>Grease</u>)

When Danny Zuko and Sandy Olsson sing the song <u>Summer Lovin</u>' in the musical Grease, they evoke memories of romance inspired in the heat of summer (and perhaps something more.) Today we face a different truth: hot summer days are not dreamy. They are awful.

Climate change is our reality now, heat records are broken year after year. Over and over again we face extreme heat warnings, cautions against even venturing out-of-doors, let alone engaging in any strenuous activity. We are surrounded by stories of people getting sick and dying because of these "hot summer days."

The problem of course is that our bodies are mostly water, and the heat has a way of sucking that needful moisture right out of us. Being human means being vulnerable, and we must always be on guard against all the forces that draw this needful element of life from us.

And what is being sucked out of you right now?

I ponder that question as I look upon the violence in the world. If it is true that God created us to live in peace and community, then the world is sucking that hope right out of our hearts. I feel like I should be more shocked than I am that someone would attempt to assassinate a a political candidate, but I find myself jaded to the point where it barely registers - just another angry individual with a weapon of mass destruction trying to work out his problems through an act of mass murder. War rages around the planet. Violence driven by desire and greed, seeking power and control, exercising fear and their personal demons, and all at the expense of innocence and children.

It isn't that no one is trying to make peace - it's just too many others are not.

I count it a blessing that my own life is conducted in relative safety, and I know that violent crime rates continue to decline in our nation. So what do we make of this almost palpable level of anger and enmity everywhere? The ability to share reasonable disagreement, the capacity to maintain relationships with those around us who have different ideas, different opinions, and different lifestyles seems to have disappeared. When did "tolerance" become a dirty word? Leaders and politicians do not talk about ideas and plans anymore. They just simply tell us that their opponent is the "worst person ever," as if that was all the motivation we needed.

We have forgotten something important. We have forgotten what we are made of.

We are creatures of Spirit. In our baptism God poured into us the living embodiment of his grace. Not mostly. All. His promise comprises our life, our being, our hope. We live in a world that is constantly trying to suck it out of us, but we are called to a life of faith to continually replenish it.

Flowers for Worship Services


Would you like to provide flowers for worship services at First Lutheran in celebration of an important event in your life or to honor someone important? We would be grateful for your gift! Please follow these directions:




