Will we ever get Lent right?

We might have a chance this year, mostly because of when and where Lent begins.

The traditional start of Lent is Ash Wednesday, which this year falls on February 14<sup>th</sup>. Yes, on Valentine's Day.

Sure, it is unfortunate that people will have to choose between taking their sweetheart out to a nice, well-deserved romantic dinner and going to church. I fear for how that choice will often go. But for those fortunate to follow their hearts, real joy will come in the realization that this moment is not so much but choosing between two seemingly opposite celebrations, but the perfect union of that one most important gift: love.

That is not necessarily the first thing we think about when it comes to Lent. We think about sacrifice and self-denial, about penance and sorrow and guilt and how we will garner enough of each to face the darkness of Good Friday. Many of us will endeavor to give up something that makes us happy as a spiritual discipline, believing that it adds value to our life and strength to our soul. We will decorate our church in dark and somber tones and seek a level of somberness in our worship that appropriately reflects what we believe this season is for.

#### We will be wrong.

This is the season of love, of beauty and peace and hope and promise. Lent is a time of focused reflection on the God who risks all to accomplish his love for us. The cross is the unfolding of a story beyond human comprehension, of unfettered grace and fulfilled promise. Lent is not a competition over who is the saddest among us. Lent is a turning toward the rapture of being absolutely overwhelmed by the love of God.

And Lent is the time to make love our identity, too. We are not sent to spread guilt and shame into the world, our word and our work is not judgment and wrath and punishment. We are the image of God, his mirror toward the world, reflecting God's love in the way we love one another. As God has not held back his grace for us, so now we must not be miserly with that grace for others. Lent is the story of how much God loves us. And now our story must be about how much we love others.

This year in Lent we will reflect on five stories of amazing love: The Woman at the Well, Zacchaeus, The Good Samaritan, The Widow's Mite, and The Road to Emmaus. In these stories we will discover anew who God loves and how he shows it, and we will ask the same questions of ourselves. Who do you love? And how will you show it?

There is a purposeful discipline to the season of Lent. It is the discipline of love, not of self-righteous sacrifice. Too often our Lenten preparations are about building ourselves up, about showing off our piety and demonstrating to ourselves and others just how good we are. But the journey of Lent is the path toward our death on the cross, toward the end of pride and self-striving, the defeat of sin and death and the devil. The cross is the victory of love, and of glory of the God who loves in such and unfathomable and irrepressible way.

The cross is the end of the kingdoms of our own design to make way for the dawn of the Kingdom of God. The purpose of love is life, rising from death, bursting forward into time and space, rolling away stones and opening hearts and changing lives. And changing the world.

Let us enter this season with open hearts and hands, that God might fill us with his love and grace, that he might send us forth as his gift to the world.



This month, our offering will be shared with **Washington County Food Pantry** 


The Washington County Food Pantry provides food to the hungry in Washington County. The food is provided through donations, purchases and the USDA.

#### "Courageous Conversations" is starting this Weekend!

When it was formed in 1986, the ELCA said that it would be a community where open, passionate, and respectful deliberation on challenging and controversial issues was not only expected but even encouraged. Meeting that lofty goal has not always been easy. But it is the right one. We are baptized to express the gift of our salvation in everything we say and do



every day. We face hard and important questions in our daily lives. The church should be a place where we can work through those questions together. Too often we follow the ways of the world, and instead of being a community of mutual love and care the church has become torn apart by suspicion and enmity. No, talking about difficult topics does not come to us naturally. But we are the bearers of the Grace of God, filled with the Holy Spirit! Having "Courageous Conversations" well is why we exist; we need to show the world how it is done. In days defined by fear, we are the antidote to all that is wrong in the world. The health of our congregation depends on our ability to have these conversations. The depth of our faith depends on growing in understanding and love. The peace of the world awaits our example of how to live together in this complicated time.

# "Courageous Conversations" are going to be after worship on Saturday, February 3rd, between services on Sunday, February 4th, and after worship on Wednesday, February 7th.

<u>Have a Heart for Hunger Campaign</u> – The thirteenth annual "HAVE A HEART FOR HUNGER" campaign will kick off on February 1<sup>st</sup> and continue through March 3<sup>rd</sup> in support of the Washington County Food Pantry. This is one of many opportunities that First Lutheran can assist with making sure no one in the community goes hungry. This year's special focus is "Easter Dinner". All items and cash contributions are welcome but the pantry has a special request for the following items: Canned Fruits and Vegetables, Jello, Marshmallows, Cake Mixes, Frosting, Muffin Mixes, Salad dressing, Croutons, Boxed Potatoes, Macaroni and Cheese, Toilet Paper, Individual Oatmeal Packages and Spaghetti Sauce and Jelly. Your donations should be left in the grocery cart in the narthex. These donated items will be distributed by the pantry during the month of March in preparation for the Easter Holiday.

In addition, First Lutheran will be co-hosting a food collection event with Family Fare here in Blair where patrons will be invited to donate food items while they shop. This event will be held on February 10<sup>th</sup> from 9:00 to 12:00 Noon. Volunteers are also needed to help staff the event. They are encouraged to sign up at the Welcome Center.

Thank you, First Lutheran Church, for your participation in this very important annual event for our community.

**First Lutheran Needs Volunteer for Washington County Recycling.** On Saturday morning, February 24<sup>th</sup>, First Lutheran members are invited to volunteer their help as a group at the Washington County Recycling Center. The Center will be open from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 Noon, but volunteers may work two-hour shifts from 8:00 to 10:00 and 10:00 to 12:00 Noon. They may also work the entire four hours if so desired. Duties will include unloading cars and sorting and processing the recycled goods for shipment. The Recycling Center is located at 440 South 3<sup>rd</sup> Street in Blair.

First Lutheran has been volunteering for this community service for a number of years. It is an excellent way of helping the community and learning more about recycling here in Blair and Washington County. Potential volunteers are encouraged to sign up at the Welcome Center.


Ash Wednesday will be February 14th this year. We will be having a 12:15pm and 6:15pm Worship with the Imposition of Ashes.
