Just today I read an article that covered a shipping shutdown in China that will impact delivery of goods until the start of 2022. What caused this shutdown? COVID-19. Two things struck me about that article: one, I still have trouble believing that a shutdown of ships in China in June will affect me in Blair during December; two, is COVID-19 still a thing? Sometimes I get so caught up living in the bubble that is the middle part of the US that I lose track of the rest of the universe.

It is weird, but I generally don't think about COVID-19 too much these days. And since I thought about it EVERY DAY for over a year, it is a rather nice break. I also don't believe we've seen the end of mask wearing, as masks proved to be a great help in reducing serious cold and flu cases as well. It would not surprise me to hear later this Fall or Winter to be invited to wear a mask to help keep people safe from airborne diseases.

But now that I don't worry as much about COVID-19, what should I worry about? Our congregation is slowly getting together again, and almost every week different people return for the first time. For some who have been away from the building over a year, it is pretty emotional to sit and ponder the majesty of God, the compassion of Jesus, and the energy of the Spirit.





### FLC AMBASSADOR SOCIAL CONCERNs COMMITTEE July 2021

**Saturday and Sunday, July 3rd and 4th** worship services will include a “**Blessing of the First Fruits**” Ceremony as we open our **Summer Garden Market**. However, our **Garden Market** will look different this year. The **GARDEN MARKET PRODUCE WILL BE A PART OF THE WEDNESDAY NIGHT MEAL**. Locally grown fresh produce from local First Lutheran Church gardeners will be a part of the Wednesday evening meals provided by First Lutheran Church this summer. Rather than the traditional market vegetable cart of the past several years, this year First Lutheran gardeners will be donating vegetables to be given to families who receive the Mid-Week Meal and are in need of produce through the summer. The produce will be delivered to them alongside their Mid-Week Meal on Wednesday evenings. According to Jim Peterson, spokesperson for the Social Concerns committee, it was felt by committee members that this would be a different and perhaps better use for the donated vegetables. Beginning the week of July 4th, donated vegetables can be brought to the church any time on Tuesday and Wednesday morning. If they are brought when the church is open (8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.) they may be put on a special table in a corner of the Fellowship Hall. Signs will be in place directing donors as to where the vegetables should be placed. If you are bringing produce to be handed out, please bring it to the church by 2pm on Wednesdays so it can be included in the meal bags. Because of this change, gardeners are encouraged to stick with the basic vegetables that they have grown. Examples include squash including zucchini, tomatoes, potatoes, sweet corn, peas, cucumbers, beets, and Carrots. Other vegetables and fruits will certainly be accepted. However, plants, flowers, and other non-food items should probably not be donated.



**Also, please note that receptacles are in place for contributions to the WASHINGTON COUNTY FOOD PANTRY any time!** Let us always remember our Lord’s admonition to “**Feed the Hungry**,” and these receptacles provide us with the opportunity to do so for our “near neighbors.”


