NEWS FROM OUR PASTOR

It's called the "Sunday Scaries." No, it's not about a long or boring sermon by the Pastor.

I heard about it on an actual national newscast – not a fluff piece on a morning TV show, but reported on the network evening news. I found advice on how to cope with the Sunday Scaries on the Cleveland Clinic website, a serious health organization.

If you haven't heard about Sunday Scaries, it is a feeling of anxiety or dread that comes upon a person as they realize that the weekend of relaxation is coming to an end and they begin to prepare themselves, mentally and emotionally, to return to work on Monday. For most, they attack in the late afternoon or evening. For some, they begin as soon as they get up on Sunday morning. They can manifest as a racing heartbeat, sweating, difficulty breathing, trembling, upset stomach, trouble sleeping and headache. In extreme cases they can cause depression or a heart attack.

There is no cure. Except maybe unemployment.

Or better employment?

I don't mean a different job. I mean a better vocation, a sense of mission and purpose and hope in life. Something that does more than just produce a paycheck, something that can get you up on Monday morning and give meaning to all the days that come after.

It fascinates me that the workweek has become the bad thing we have to get through in order to earn or deserve the good thing that comes after. Work is a necessity, leisure is the reward. Or perhaps work is penalty and rest is merely a conditional release. On the one hand we claim to value hard work. "All play and no work makes Jack a dumb jerk." We expect hard work from everybody else. The worst thing you can be in this world is someone who does not earn their keep, someone who is lazy, living on handouts. But in truth we hate work, and we all secretly yearn for that winning lottery ticket that will set us free.

And isn't the most amazing thing that we have created a world that rewards the hardest working people least, while those few who actually live a life of leisure didn't actually work for it at all. What an upside down way to exist! If that isn't scary, I do not know what it is.

What if we could turn it all upside down?

I don't think the problem is work. I think work is good, I think we were made for work. But we were made for good work. Not just for good jobs or good careers but gifted and equipped by the Holy Spirit of God to do Work That Actually Matters. Faith is work, in fact it's very hard work. Doing the right thing, not giving into despair, letting the love of God flow through us in everything we say and do takes intent and focus and energy.

Discipleship is about specific works, but even these are just manifestations of the constant work of commending the spirit within us. The acts of discipleship - worship, prayer, study, serving, giving, encouraging, inviting - flow from a heart-set that is founded in and daily embraces the gift of God's grace. And if that heart is right, then what flows from it is not work. What flows from it is life.

Sometimes I wonder if we don't have Saturdays Scaries, dreading our weekly church requirement and everything that comes with that. No question that we have over the years made church more of a responsibility than an opportunity. There is a kind of quietism rampant through Christian communities. We are good at declaring our allegiance. We would just rather not have to do anything for it. There is nothing so frightening as the call from the Pastor asking us to do something at church.

That is by no means what Luther meant when he said we are saved by grace. The reformers believed that faith should produce good works - organically, expectantly, daily. Not as a job, but as a vocation, a purpose, a life.

The true joy of faith is not that we have it. The true joy of faith is the work it empowers us to do. Hi ho, hi ho, so off to work we go!

FLC AMBASSADOR SOCIAL CONCERNS COMMITTEE June 2023

UPDATE on LENTEN INGATHERING for OAKS INDIAN MISSION indicates that we can now track an additional \$87.19 which was added to the cost of merchandise ordered by congregation members and received by OAKS INDIAN MISSION from Amazon, making a total of \$591.09 plus \$580 cash received in the church office, bringing the total value of our emphasis to \$1,171.09. We sincerely thank all of you who contributed to this emphasis in any way, and pass on the deep appreciation of OAKS INDIAN MISSION to you!

Our BREAD for the WORLD OFFERING OF LETTERS of advocacy to our Senators Pete Ricketts, Deb Fischer, and Representative Adam Smith took place on April 26, 29, and 30, and yielded 136 signed letters sent, equally divided between our three national legislators. The purpose was to advocate for expanded nutrition for those in need, both in this country and abroad, since these issues are treated in the Farm Bill which will be reauthorized by Congress during this calendar year. These figures represent the letters which were signed by congregation members during or after worship services on the above noted dates or returned to the church in the week following. A total of 114 letter packets (containing letters to all three legislators) were passed out to congregation members. It is unknown how many letters might have been signed, stamped, and mailed by congregation members from home. A big THANK YOU to ALL who participated in this endeavor to carry out our Lord's command "to feed the hungry" by advocating for building healthy, equitable, and sustainable food systems for all.

Our MOTHERS' DAY INGATHERING for THE BRIDGE CRISIS CENTER will continue through MAY 31, after which the items collected in the tubs located in the narthex and the cash gifts turned in to the church office will be transferred to our local **Bridge** office located in Memorial Community Hospital and utilized as warranted by mothers and children in need. **THANK YOU** for your compassion to those who have responded to this ingathering which helps mothers and children who are in situations of great need in Washington, Burt, Dodge, Cuming, and Saunders Counties.

The BLESSING OF THE FIRST FRUITS CEREMONY and the OPENING OF OUR SUMMER GARDEN MARKET will take place on June 17 and 18 at all four services. You are invited to share your excess garden produce, your flowers, and your baked goods! Proceeds will go to ELCA WORLD HUNGER. Produce may be brought to the church and placed on the Garden Cart any time when the church is open--preferably prior to 3:00 P.M. on Fridays and between 4:00 P.M. and 7:00 P.M. on Saturdays.


