NEWS FROM OUR PASTOR

The standard contract for Transitional ministers includes the instruction: "Align the congregation in accordance with the constitutions and bylaws of the ELCA, the Nebraska Synod, and update the congregation's constitution and bylaws."

It's not the most fun part of the calling.

But it is a valuable, even important task. The constitution of the congregation provides the foundation on which the entirety of the ministry is built. It describes the purpose and nature of the church, sets expectations for members, creates the process for the congregation to call Ministers and organize itself for mission. Not everyone appreciates the level of detail in the thousands of words contained in the document, but everyone is affected by them, knowingly or not.

In October we will be voting to update the constitution of First Lutheran Church, last done in 2015, to include new language updated by the ELCA in the meantime. Most of the changes are technical in nature, but several reflect important new understandings about the church and ministry.

Some highlights:

<u>Chapter 6</u> – Church Affiliation. The requirements for a congregation to terminate its affiliation with the ELCA have been expanded. The process now requires super-majority votes at two separate, legally-called meetings of the congregation, 90 days apart and in consultation with the Bishop. As has always been the case, property ownership remains with the ELCA pending appeal to the Synod Council.

<u>Chapter 8</u> – Membership. A new category for "Seasonal members" has been established to spell out the rights and responsibilities of church members who reside in the area for only part of the year and participate in life of the congregation during that time. This may have a greater effect on some FLC members who have summer homes in other places.

<u>Chapter 9</u> – the Rostered Minister. Much work has been done in the ELCA over the past decade to understand and describe the role of ministers who are not ordained for Word and Sacrament ministry. The end result of this work has been to create the office of Ministers of Word and Service, or Deacons. These servants of the church are distinguished from Ministers of Word and Sacrament by their particular roles.

- Ministers of Word and Sacrament. Pastors serve with active, courageous faith to offer the hope of the sacraments and to proclaim the good news of Jesus Christ in congregations and other ministry settings. Some pastors are called to specialized ministries such as chaplaincy and campus ministry.
- Ministers of Word and Service. Deacons serve in congregations and other ministries of the ELCA, including family ministries, youth, administration, volunteer ministry, social services, music or parish nursing. Deacons connect the church with the needs of the world and work to equip others to lead a living, active and caring Christian life.

There is extensive new language in the constitution to govern congregations and Deacons in their ministry together. Other updates to the constitution clarify the specific calling of the Minister of Word and Sacrament.

<u>Chapter 10</u> – Congregational Meeting. Allowance is made for electronic or remote participation in congregational meetings in keeping with applicable state laws.

<u>Chapter 12</u> – Congregational Council. The updated constitution requires the council to include at least one youth member and one young adult member, which it already does at FLC. The FLC Church Council has determined that members may serve only one three year consecutive term.

<u>Chapter 13</u> – Congregational Committees. The updated constitution includes an Audit Committee and a Mutual ministry committee.

The Bylaws of the congregation are not being updated at this time.

Complete copies of the updated will be available online or printed copies will be available by request. New language is indicated in red type, deleted language is struck out.

The Procedure

In order to make it possible for everyone at First Lutheran Church to participate in updating the constitution but also to ensure the needed quorum to complete the process we will be following these steps:

- 1. Copies of the constitution with all of the updates will be made available online and in print beginning in September.
- 2. On September 16th, 17th, and 20th, we will hold open forums to review the updates to the constitution. Any recommendations by members of the congregation to add or eliminate the updates will be given to the church council for action at their October meeting.
- 3. At its regular meeting on October 12th the Church Council will review any further proposed changes to the updated constitution and anything that is approved will become part of the final vote.
- 4. Following worship services on October 14th, 15th and 18th, members of the congregation will vote to approve the updated constitution. There will be no further opportunity for motions or amendments at this point this will be a simple YES or NO vote. Members who disapprove of the updates may, of course, vote against the updated constitution and it will be reconsidered at a later date.

Pastor Glen will be leading the congregation through this process.




