NEWS FROM OUR PASTOR

It could have turned out differently for Jared.¹

Once upon a time, there was a chance for a different life for Jared, a different ending. He was baptized in a Christian church, he had grandparents of sincere and deep faith and a family tree full of committed and caring church-going aunts, uncles, cousins. In his time he attended Sunday School and Confirmation as all children should do and as many in fact do. A path was set for him toward a life that most of us would consider normal, a path that should have led to happiness and fulfillment and peace.

If only he had followed it.

Instead, he grew up a troubled kid in the manner of most troubled kids. There were family problems. He failed at school and dropped out. He plunged into a life filled with alcohol and drugs and scrapes with the law, he spent more and more time in and out of various programs and jail. And then that fateful night, at the far-too-young age of 24, he drank a bottle of Tequila and got behind the wheel of his car and that mistake cost him his life and his family much grief, which they did not deserve.

And whose fault is that?

We might wonder about the forces that had broken his life, the missteps of his parents or the bad influences of his peers or the slights of his community. But was I responsible? I had undertaken a sacred oath and lifelong calling to stand with the Jared's of the world, to proclaim the love of God to them in word and deed, to be an instrument of the grace that I believe very deeply has healing and life-giving power.

But I had not done that. In truth, Jared, like many others, stood outside of my reach. He never attended church services, never listened to one of my sermons or shared one of my bible studies. He never came to me for counsel or care. He existed, instead, in a different world, a distant diaspora, not a person but a statistic that puzzled and questioned me, an enigma that I could not solve. He was a stranger who I only experienced as the subject of an occasional conference workshop and who existed only on the fringes of my prayers. Whether it was because I never tried or because I never could, the heart-breaking truth is that I never reached him.

And he died. And I buried him – my one and only chance to be his Pastor.

After Jared's funeral, I was confronted by the truth that the decline of the church is much more than low attendance or budget shortfalls. For all of our good intentions and faithful works, the church – me! – is barely saving those who sit week after week in her pews, much less the vast majority of God's children who had already wandered away from the sheepfold. Jesus had placed this sacred charge on his followers, to feed, to love, to protect, to save lost sheep.

It is an overwhelming call.

We live in a world that celebrates the bright and shiny. We envy and emulate churches that look impressive and seem successful. But that's not our mission, that's not our purpose. We are not called to be great, we are called to be good. We must not measure ourselves in the world's terms – size, wealth, status – but in the measure of grace that flows in and through us. We must stop counting the number of persons in our pews and instead count the numbers of Jared's near and far who live just beyond our grasp.

This is harder work.

In 30 years I have not found the perfect answer to this hard question. Nor do I know who has. But I pray that we would at least start asking it. And I believe that the answer (if there is one) has less to do with growing churches than it has to do with growing hearts. We need to be freed from what not matter so we serve better what does. As we consider what lies ahead for our church and our community, may we be mindful of those who are desperate for grace.







FLC Treasurer's Financial Update:

Dear FLC Congregation,

We are so lucky to have you as a member of the FLC community. Thank you for your support and continued participation. We are happy to provide congregants like you with programs and events that lift us up and remind us of the importance of having a giving spirit.

To continue offering the services that we do, we are here to request an increase in giving throughout the remainder of 2023. Through May, FLC is behind our revenue budget by \$41,767. Our remaining year budgeted revenue is \$356,000 (approximately \$50,000 per month) which means that in total we need to generate giving of approximately \$400,000 prior to December 31. Please take a look at your current financial situation and see if there is a way you can help FLC meet its revenue budget. By doing so, this will allow for sufficient funds so FLC does not have to dip into reserve accounts to pay for general expenses.
