Ash Wednesday (March 2) begins the season of Lent, and this year we are going to talk about how God tears into our reality to help us see where we can turn to see the wonder and beauty of God. God enters our world rather violently at times, even the birth of Jesus is a bit of violence if taken from the view of his mother. Welcomed violence for sure, but still not without pain and blood. God tears at our reality to show God's preferred future for us.

"Torn: Shredding the Fabric of our Lies" will spend six weeks helping us to see where God breaks into our reality in order to turn us away from lies we tell about ourselves and our world, and open to us God's reality of peace and joy. Life will be torn, we will open our hearts and minds to God rending us from the lies to reveal a new way to live and be.



#### FLC AMBASSADOR SOCIAL CONCERNS COMMITTEE February 2022

OUR 10<sup>TH</sup> ANNUAL "HAVE A HEART FOR HUNGER" campaign will kick off on February 1 and continue through the end of the month in support of the Washington County Food Pantry.



This is another opportunity for FLC to assist with making sure that no one in the community goes

Hungry! We will be involving the community again this year with a special collection day at Family Fare on Saturday, February 12, 9:00 A.M.-1:00 P.M. When you come that day during those hours you will be greeted by a friendly face or two who will hand you a flyer that notes the most urgent items needed by our Washington County Food Pantry. For a "heads up" note the list below:

cereal boxed potatoes condiments: tuna hamburger helper salad dressings, mayo pancake mix jelly oatmeal packets Manwich barbeque sauce canned corn (individual) other canned veggies Shake and bake ketchup, mustard, etc.

As you proceed with your shopping you will notice signs at the items above to grab your attention. Then, when you get through the check-out counters, you will notice more happy faces collecting the items which you have purchased specifically for the **Washington County Food Pantry**, and packing them for later delivery to the **Food Pantry**. You may also donate cash or checks there which will be gratefully received since the **Pantry** is able to buy food at wholesale prices and can make your shopping dollars go further. Our goal for this collection is **1,500 pounds**.

For your convenience we will also be collecting food at FLC throughout the month. Here are the guidelines we are targeting for that food ingathering:

Week 1 Box Week

Week 2 Bag and Package Week

Week 3 Cans, Jars, and Containers Week

Week 4 Miscellaneous Toiletries Week (individual toothbrushes, bar soap, toilet tissue)

We will have a grocery cart and/or plastic bins available at a convenient location to collect these items, which will be delivered to **W.C.F.P.** and weighed after each weekend collection. Our goal for this collection is **600 pounds.** Monetary gifts are also invited, which can be taken to the office.

Did you know that the Washington County Food Pantry serves on average 101 families, 265 individuals, and 5,556 meals each month? Thus, it is clear that the agency is filling a huge need in our community!

Let's all give some <u>really good</u> VALENTINES to our neighbors in need during this very important annual service project!
