#### NEWS FROM OUR PASTOR

He began to teach them many things in parables, and in his teaching he said to them: "Listen! A sower went out too sow." Mark 4:2–4

Telling parables is pretty standard fare for Jesus, and many of them are in some form or another about agriculture – planting, tending, reaping. It's a common subject for him because it's a common subject for his audience.

Doesn't it seem like he should know more about it?

The Sower in Jesus' parable seems to be the worst of all gardeners, randomly tossing the seed to and fro, sometimes among the weeds (which he should have cleared out long ago!), sometimes among the rocks, and sometimes missing the field entirely and throwing the seeds on the path. It's not a surprise that he gets mixed results. It's a wonder that he gets a crop at all.

Doesn't he know that seed is precious? Doesn't he have any pride, any drive for success?

In the real world such negligence would not be tolerated. The real world is driven by results, by achievement, by success. And substandard outcomes would not be tolerated. Even the good crop would only become the baseline for next years higher goal. Waste, unproductiveness, mistakes – these things have no place in the real world.

But is there room for the extravagance of Grace?

The parable of the Sower is remarkable in its description of the depth and breath of the love of God. He does not dole it out sparingly in bits and pieces, only where it brings him the greatest return. He does not share it only based on merit or potential return-on-investment. Instead he flings it far and wide, hither and yon, as if that would be sufficient to generate his expected results.

He actually seems to believe that we will take in his love and grace and bloom, redeemed and transformed to bear the fruits of salvation in the world and bring to life his kingdom of peace and justice. He treats us like fertile ground, worthy of his Word, well prepared and fertile, perfect to fulfill the promise of creation.

He's so wrong.

We are the weed-choked field, distracted by a million shiny objects in every moment, slaves to our fears and pains and worldly desires. We are the shallow soil where seeds go to die, weakened by the struggles and challenges of being human, carrying far-too heavy burdens of sorrow and suffering. And yes, sometimes we are fertile and life-giving, but our goodness is too often short-lived. We have hope, but we are miserly with it, and the sins of hatred, violence and inequity continue to abound. Why does God even try?

No, it is not because he trusts us. It's because he trusts the seed.







Dear Representative Smith Dear Senator Fischer (or) Ricketts

The Farm Bill is our nation 's most important national food system legislation. It is critical to the work of reducing hunger at home and abroad. Indeed, the Farm Bill impacts each one of us. As Congress works to renew our food and farm products through the Farm Bill, I urge you to support legislation that builds healthy, equitable, and sustainable food systems.

Specifically, I ask you to:

- Increase access to fresh fruits and vegetables by increasing support for produce specific Supplemental Nutrition Program (SNAP) benefits to the Gus Schumacher Nutrition Incentive Program (Gus NP) which provides resources on top of monthly SNAP benefits for a limited number of households to use toward the purchase of fresh fruits and vegetables primarily at farmers 'markets.
- Eliminate barriers to SNAP for marginalized populations. For example, end the ban on former drug offenders, eliminate work requirements for college students, and permit indigenous communities to administer SNAP and other federal nutrition programs on reservations.
- Keep food out of landfills by increasing support for post-harvest food recovery efforts and address threat to food security posed by extreme weather.
- Support funding for international food aid programs such as Food for Peace.
