NEWS FROM OUR PASTOR

Jesus said to the disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest. Go on your way. See, I am sending you out like lambs into the midst of wolves. Carry no purse, no bag, no sandals ... Luke 10:2–4

I stand in the middle of a room – pretty much any room in either house at this point - and gaze at the piles of boxes, some empty, some opened and half-empty, some still tightly taped shut, unmarked and unremembered, and I wonder, "what have I done?"

I didn't like moving when I was young enough to handle it. I like it much less now. It's a really good thing that this is going to be worth it.

There are a lot of "if only" moments for me these days. If only we had taken the time to prepare, to clear out some of our stuff before we tried to move. If only we had made a better plan, been more organized, thought further ahead, practiced patience. Life right now is a daily reminder that we are not nearly in as much control of ourselves and our existence as we have tended to believe.

I have learned a few hard things:

First, we possess a lot of rather unimportant junk, a cornucopia of stuff we have accumulated over time. Perhaps at the moment it seemed good or important. But these things cling to us, hanging on as if by some mysterious unseen power. It turns out that it is hard to let go of possessions at any time, even when they become so obviously an unneeded burden.

Second, we possess a lot of rarely-used stuff, items that were purposeful at one time, and, we imagine, might be again in the future. That possibility seems to outweigh the cost of keeping them, even if it means moving and storing them for some indeterminate amount of time.

And thirdly, we have the things that we use and will continue to use regularly, what we find to be needful for our daily functioning. The only problem with this stuff is that we used to know where it was and where it should be. But now our environment has changed and we have to figure out the right place for everything so we can get back to normal routines.

And then perhaps the worst thing, amid the overflowing mass of detritus which threatens to bury us, is the unearthing of needs for which we are un- or ill-equipped. The most insane moments of late have been the discovery of what we do not yet have but probably need, certainly want, even as we deal with the overwhelming amount of what we have that we neither need nor want.

But that's life. This conversation is not just about furnishings or household goods, it's about human nature, the fears and anxieties that drive our need to possess, our inability to cast off what we can or adapt what we must, our unpreparedness for what should be foreseeable. Faith, by its best practice for life, requires such skill of us. Grace, at its best, equips us daily for that work.

We would do well, if I can borrow the phrase, to take a fearless and searching inventory of our stuff - the practices and notions that fill the boxes of our lives. How much of our beliefs, how much of our pieties, are little more than habits or traditions we hold on to needlessly because we thought once upon a time were good or right and now cling so stubbornly to our souls? And perhaps we ought take measure of what we are holding on to "just in case," assuming a future that may or may not come to pass. And, more importantly, can we evaluate where we are now, this place God has brought us, and assess anew how our assumptions and expectations fit here? In all things we must be present in our new surroundings and understand that we cannot expect the world to bend itself to us. We must be the ones to acclimate to where we are and answer the call of discipleship to GO!

And then – AND THEN – our eyes will be truly opened to what we are missing, what is truly needful, what is possible and hopeful and good. Having cast off what is un-useful, wasteful, even just wrong, we are opened to fresh blessings. Followers of Jesus travel with empty bags and outstretched hands and open minds, workers in the harvest of the Grace of God.

FLC Treasurer's Financial Update for August 2024

Dear FLC Congregation,

We are so lucky to have you as a member of the FLC community. Thank you for your support and continued congregational support. We are happy to provide congregants like you with programs and events that lift us up and remind us of the importance of having a giving spirit.

To continue offering the services that we do, we are here to request an increase in giving throughout the remainder of 2024. Through July, FLC's general fund revenue is below budget by \$16,000. Our remaining year budgeted revenue is \$250,000 (approximately \$50,000 per month). Expenses are holding strong as FLC has spent \$7,000 less than budget. Thank you to the staff as they continue to try and find ways to save costs.

Please take a moment to assess your current financial situation and see if there is a way you can help FLC meet its financial goals.

On behalf of the church council, thank you again for being such an important part of the FLC community.


