Recipient will receive \$1,000 to offset the cost of one of the following CCIM designation courses: CI 102, CI 103 or CI 104.

Procedure

Applications are submitted directly to the individual's local CCIM Chapter. The Scholarship Committee will determine the winners from all eligible applicants.

Deadline for Submission to Chapters

November 10, 2020.

Recipient Notification

Email notification will be sent on or before December 8, 2020, notifying those selected. Recipients will also be announced at the December luncheon.
