Pastor's Report

Greetings Friends,

This year we stride into a 2021 with hope as we eagerly turn the page on a challenging 2020.

High Church remains vibrant as we commit to continue being the beacon on the hill for the surrounding towns we have always been; praising God, serving our community, and looking for new opportunities to serve our neighbors as the Covid 19 pandemic rages on. Yet we have renewed optimism because with vaccines on the horizon, we can start to see God's light at the end of a long, dark period.

At the end of 2019, we bade farewell to secretary Erin Burdette and at the turn of the year welcomed back longtime friend and colleague May Sweet as office manager to work with Sandy Bee Lynn on keeping the church office running smoothly.

2020 began with Epiphany Sunday. This year we celebrated the wise men's journey to the baby Jesus by receiving star words. After worship we dined on "King Cakes" made by several church members. After a frantic search throughout the church to discover who got the piece with the baby Jesus hidden inside, it was found downstairs in Forrest Swain's slice, sitting uneaten as he counted the morning offerings! The children took turns dressing as the three kings, and we caravanned to several of our older members homes to serenade them with carols accompanied by chimes.

In February, we chased away our cabin fever with Beach Day at the Wadsworth YMCA. Lent began with our Ash Wednesday service which included a burning bowl ritual and the imposition of ashes.

In March, our Lenten programming was abruptly interrupted as a statewide stay-at-home order was put in place due to the covid-19 pandemic starting to spread in Ohio.

We, like most other churches, quickly started to revise our ministries, learning how to broadcast worship services live via a new thing called "Zoom". Zoom allowed us to video conference over the internet. It was a bumpy start for all of us.

- Many of our members were not experienced in using the internet this way and had some trouble at first signing on.
- Pastor Gaye had a learning curve using Zoom to create a worship service, and there was some early confusion (especially around muting!).
- So many churches decided to use Zoom that it crashed on one Sunday morning in April, and church had to be cancelled for the day.

Yet through it all, our church family remained loyal and in good humor. Hoping that the pandemic would abate by Easter so that we might return in person, but it was not to be. Maundy Thursday was a virtual event led by our Elders online. And Easter was also held online.

In June, we celebrated our graduating seniors with a drive-by parade at each senior's home accompanied by the delivery of a gift, loud honks, & plenty of good wishes and prayers for the future.

The Soup Kitchen in Barberton and the Doylestown Annual Yard Sale were both cancelled this year, but we continued to support the Doylestown Community Food Cupboard with donations collected in a bin on the church porch.

In September, we gathered for worship at Memorial Park for the annual Blessing of the Animals. Soon after, local high school football games were closed to most visitors, so we held a drive-in movie in our parking lot. We showed the high school football movie, "Remember the Titans."

In October, we gathered for a socially distanced "Trunk or Treat" event. Cars were decorated, and kids of all ages decked out in costumes, received their treats, and paraded through the parking lot. We handed out candy with plastic gloves and tongs, and we wore face coverings for safety. Everyone was grateful to gather and see one another. It was a great success and will be expanded next year. While the festivities were happening however, a motorcycle caravan with many bikes rode by on Eastern Road. One rider became distracted by our parking lot proceedings and drove into the culvert on the side of the road and EMS had to be called. The rider was not seriously injured.

In November, we honored our saints on the first Sunday by worshipping in our cars outside. It was a very windy and rainy-day challenging worship leaders to struggle mightily against the weather. The following church family members that passed in 2020 were remembered in the service: Wanda Wintrow, Tom Henderson, Mary Jo Kun, Marge LaRoche, Dolores Frase and Nancy Dean. On Veterans Day, Rev. Dr. John Schluep, retired pastor and founder of Warriors' Journey Home was our guest preacher. He spoke of the important need for spiritual support for many of our returning vets. Near the end of the month, Helen Tritt delivered over 30 Advent wreaths with candles to our church families. We used them throughout Advent by lighting them together during Sunday worship. Different families led us in lighting our wreaths each week from their homes to ours.

We closed out the challenging year with a second round of deliveries for Christmas Eve. Each family received a luminary bag with a candle and sand, candles for each family member to light during the Silent Night hymn on Christmas Eve, and candy canes with the candy's legend included. Many church members participated in leading the virtual service through recording themselves singing or playing each of the traditional Christmas eve hymns. And as we do every year, we prayed together and welcomed the baby Jesus into our hearts. It was truly a service to remember.

A positive impact of the 2020 pandemic was that we finished remodeling the narthex by reducing a closet adjacent to the elevator and giving the entire room along with the offices a fresh coat of paint. New carpet was laid in the offices and narthex as well. An upgraded video streaming system was also installed to enable homebound, vacationing, or visiting folks to join worship from anywhere.

Other 2020 accomplishments include creating outbound communications three times per week including Music Mondays performed by our organists, a midweek update of announcements and events, and a Thursday devotion read by Holly Poetter.

I look forward to serving High Church in 2021. I feel blessed to be pastor of such a loving community. May we continue to be the faithful stewards of our wonderful church!

Elder's meeting agenda: The Board of Elders meets every month. Each meeting opens with a prayer and a discussion of our church family's joys and concerns, a review of old, discussion of new business, and Pastor's report reviewed.

Communion: The elders assist the Pastor by supplying, preparing, and serving regular communion on the first Sunday. Due to moving to virtual-only meetings, preparation for in-person service communion took place from January through March 2020. The church purchased multiple single-serve communion cups for members to utilize while worshiping at home.

The Elder's continued to maintain the Shepherding list in 2020. The secretary staff makes calls to those members who are not able to leave their homes.

Starting in March, Elder's adjusted to virtual-only meetings and worship service in place of meeting at the church to ensure the members' safety. The Elder's supported the Consistory in July 2020 to obtain responses to the Return to In-Person Service survey.

Healing Services continued quarterly in 2020, lead by Pastor Gaye, in the church at the beginning of the year and then virtual via zoom for the remainder of 2020, with the Elder's support.

Emanuel could not participate in Family Promise in 2020 due to the program being placed on hold due to Covid. This program helps homeless families with children stay together and achieve sustainable independence.

Christian Education Committee Report

Activities:

January: 3 King Caroling to elderly church members. We gave them a bag with gifts of gold candy, sachet with frankincense and myrrh, hot chocolate, crackers, and candy.

February: Beach Day at the Wadsworth YMCA. We swam for 1.5 hours and then enjoyed time together with food and fellowship.

March – May: Activities cancelled. Kids Corner emails with stories read by members sent out weekly.

June: Drive-by graduate recognition parade with members going to 3 graduates' houses, and graduates were given gift bag full of cards and goodies.

July: Vacation Bible School was a take-home packet. Children received lessons, crafts, snacks, music CD, and incentive items around the railroad theme. Thirty-five children received VBS packets.

August: The Blessing of the Backpack was held via Zoom. The children received a railroad themed tag to add to their backpack at the drive-in, or it was delivered to their home. Outdoor Movie Drive-In watched *Back to the Future*.

September: Outdoor Movie Drive-In watched Remember the Titans.

October: Bibles were presented to our third-graders. Trunk-or-Treat was held on a Sunday afternoon. We had 15 trunks participating and over 60 trick-or-treaters. It was a huge success. *Coco* movie cancelled due to weather.

November: Families could request advent wreaths to use during Zoom worship. Twenty-nine wreaths were delivered. All children received advent calendars.

December: Children's Christmas Program was not able to be performed, but we were able to play the video of the Christmas program performed in 2015 during Zoom worship.

Sunday School:

Throughout the year, we have been able to continue the children's Sunday School program. Sunday School material was mailed and delivered throughout the spring and summer. In September, Sunday School resumed via Zoom following the church service. Materials are delivered to the children's home prior to Sunday morning.
