

How they voted: Infrastructure Investment & Jobs Act

Editor's Note: On Nov. 5, 2021, the U.S. House of Representatives voted to approve a historic \$1 trillion infrastructure bill on a bipartisan vote of 228-206, with a majority of Democrats and 13 Republicans voting to send the bill to the president's desk.

Of California's 53-member House Delegation, all 42 Democrats voted for the bill, and all 11 of California's Republican members voted no. What follows is the breakdown of the vote according to the clerk of the U.S. House of Representatives.
