Easter Resurrection Power Experienced in Cuba

My how your prayers, supplies and monetary gifts spoke volumes to your sister church! It is an example of the reality of 2 Corinthians 9:11 which says, **"You will be** made rich in every way so that you can be generous on every occasion, AND THROUGH US YOUR GENEROSITY WILL RESULT IN THANKSGIVING TO **GOD."** But to paraphrase Sherry Rodriquez Craig, it is not so much what we did for them, but what they did for us. The trip was a huge success, and God's covering was very evident.

The details are so powerful, but space forces severe editing in this written celebration of resurrection power at work in us on the Cuba mission trip. You will get the ideas here, and perhaps we can post fuller testimonies on-line.

You've heard of the harassment Christians receive, like our sister church being confiscated in the past, but glory to God, it all legally belongs again to the Methodist Church of

Cuba. In like manner, on this trip, our **Pastor's wife** (Dayani) was arrested in El Bon while Pastor Darier was in Havana picking us up at the airport. The charge:

Hoarding building materials. Yet the only materials they had were those legally obtained for their house expansion project to increase classrooms and to provide a little privacy at the parsonage. Only I knew first and the Pastor required my confidential prayer so that we did not put any fear in the team. He made a plan so that when we arrived at our sister church many hard miles away, he could turn himself in (while I was with the team in other activities at the church). He sat in jail for hours, but finally was temporarily released being told that they were not through and he was not in the clear. His courage and faith in our resurrected Lord allowed him to continue joyous service to

us and his church throughout the week. He was not cleared till after we were safely home in America. Side Note from Vicki: I asked Pastor Darier if they hurt his wife. He said, "No, they just harassed her verbally." Then his face lit up

and he added, "She was braver than me!" THAT'S OUR PASTORA! A mighty woman of God!

Here are some other examples of God at work for which you can praise Him:

Vicki continues to praise God for all of the unseen miracles and travel mercies when so much could have gone wrong. God provided everything needed for the largest mission team from First Lutz to ever enter El Bon. Psalm 91:4 says, "He will cover you with his feathers, and under his wings you will find refuge;



his faithfulness will be your shield and rampart."

You may not understand the amount of intense spiritual warfare that went on before we left, and the miracle of our departure when things had just begun to get scary with the virus, but we travailed in prayer and discussion. The trip was almost cancelled. Seventy seven year old Ed said, "I'm definitely going!" After much instruction about the sobering care we should give to protect ourselves and others, Dianne shared how she was called by God and felt she must go, and she would use her nursing skills to protect and help the team if others decided to go. HOW TO GET TO A ZOOM MEETING:

On your cell phone or tablet, go to your App Store or Play Store; then load the free app entitled ZOOM Cloud Meetings. You can do this on your computer, but you have to have a camera and a microphone connected. Click on Join a Meeting; On the Meeting ID line, it should say 440 152 9666 (if not, type it in); then click on Join Meeting; click on Join with Video; once

connected, you can swipe to the left to see who all is connected (may need to swipe to the left more than once to see all in the meeting room). You can swipe left or right during the meeting to see the face of the one who is speaking. When you're not speaking, you can mute your speaker at the bottom left. Just touch the screen, and the options appear. It's fun!

Ministries that are Still Happening Bible Classes: We are offering classes, prayer and sharing times through the ZOOM app (see above paragraph above for how to become involved).

Lenten Prayer via ZOOM: Since we can't physically pray in our Lenten Prayer Nook at the Church, you are invited to pray in the safety of your homes by joining our virtual Prayer Nook, which will draw us together in a time of community when we are having to social distance. If you join us for any of these times, there will be someone hosting with a brief devotional or sharing of scripture, sharing of prayer requests between people, and then a short time of prayer. You can share requests and pray or just be there to participate in quiet spirit - it's really up to you. RESURRECTION COOKIES RECIPE AND STORY

SUPPLIES

1 Zip Top Plastic Bag 1 Wooden Spoon Hand mixer Wax Paper Masking or Painter's Tape Bible

INGREDIENTS

1 cup Almonds or Pecans, whole

1 tsp Vinegar

3 Egg Whites

1 pinch Salt

1 cup Sugar

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Preheat oven to 300°
- 2. Place nuts in zip top bag and let kids beat them with the wooden spoon to break into small pieces. Explain that after Jesus was arrested He was beaten by the Roman soldiers. Read John 19:1-3
- 3. Let each child smell the vinegar, then put 1 teaspoon into a mixing bowl. Explain that when Jesus was thirsty on the cross He was given vinegar to drink. Read John 19:28-30
- 4. Add egg whites to vinegar. Eggs represent life. Explain that Jesus gave His life to give us life. Read John 10:10-11
- 5. Sprinkle a little salt into each child's hand. Let them taste it, then put the rest into the mixing bowl. Explain that this represents the salty tears shed by Jesus' followers and the bitterness of our own sin.

 Read Luke 23:27
- Add 1 cup sugar. Explain that the sweetest part of the story is that Jesus died because He loves us. He wants us to know and belong to Him. Read Psalm 34:8 and John 3:16
- Beat on high speed for 12 to 15 minutes until stiff peaks are formed. Explain that the color white represents the purity in God's eyes of those whose sins have been cleansed by Jesus. Read Isaiah 1:18 and John 3:1-3
- 8. Fold in broken nuts. Drop by teaspoon onto a cookie sheet covered with waxed paper. Explain that each mound represents the rocky tomb where Jesus' body was laid. Read Matthew 27:57-60
- 9. Put the cookie sheet in the oven, close the door and turn the oven OFF. Give each child a piece of tape and seal the oven door. Explain that Jesus' tomb was sealed. Read Matthew 27: 65-66
- 10. GO TO BED! Explain that they may feel sad to leave the cookies in the oven overnight. Jesus' followers were in despair when the tomb was sealed. Read John 16:20 & 22
- 11. On Resurrection Sunday (Easter) morning, open the oven and give everyone a cookie. Notice the cracked surface and take a bite. The cookies are hollow! On the first Easter Jesus' followers were amazed to find the tomb open and empty. Read Matthew 28:1-9

reminded us of the courageous story of Joshua and Caleb who believed the Israelites should go as they were called. It was the team members themselves who decided they had put their hand to the plow and God did not want them to look back (see Luke 9:62). Thank you, again, Church, for all of your prayers. God used them to help us experience another resurrection power victory!

Dianne received many unexpected medical supplies that came in for this trip, with extras of the type to help fight the virus. She cared for each one of us and many Cubans, as well.

Lynn, our team leader, has also been praising God with us all, due to the fact that all of the specialized medications made it safely through Customs. At the time, we didn't know how important nebulizers and Albuterol would be in helping to fight the COVID-19 virus! It's a miracle to know that our little village of El Bon now has plenty of these medications!

Among other things, Charlie brought strength and peace to the team. Sarah danced before the Lord, and Jordan summarized the Youth Sunday School lesson for the whole Church.

In La Irma, a village time forgot, a missionary asked Lynn for a book bag for a child. Lynn gave her Jordan's. Inside was a Children's Bible, placed there by God! Dianne also had a wooden prayer cross at hand to give her. The missionary clutched it to her chest as a dear treasure! As we were leaving, Vicki handed chocolate candy out of the window of the bus to the kids. Smiles abounded for this very rare treat!

While there, Jordan got a touch of something requiring an antibiotic. Before leaving on our trip, Dianne had picked up some prescriptions and she saw an antibiotic she hadn't requested in her bag. It was just what Jordan needed. Jehovah Jireh - God our Provider! Jordan enjoyed the trip, and he has been fine ever since. Praise God!

Jackson saw that some regions had no gas and was grateful God guided us so that we could get back in time safely, and that we could go again some day. Some of the people there took time off from their much needed work just to help us and be with us. Seeing the children's faces when they saw us was something straight from God. It was like they were welcoming us home. I had really looked forward to seeing them again and worshipping with them. During the trip I felt like I can't believe I'm down here again, sharing my love with the Cuban people I love. Now that I am home, I think about how that bus ride was long; but man, was it worth it. Wow, when can I go again?!!

Tim shares his God Moments - The first God moment I had was when I decided to not take my sons on the trip because of the virus. But during our meeting (the night before leaving), something just didn't feel right about not taking the boys. After listening to the others on the team share about their conviction in going, I felt my boys had to go. Even if the worst happened, we were meant to be together and experience whatever lay ahead. It was the right decision! As Pastor Darier later preached, we need others to fan the flame of our faith, and that is what happened during that meeting. There were so many little obstacles, some of which could have had major consequences, but it seemed like we were too busy traveling on God's mission to let those things slow us down. In addition to what has been mentioned, some examples included surviving the insanely rough roads for 17 hours of driving without blowing a tire or having some other major mechanical failure. And, the bus starting after completely dying for several minutes in a very remote area of the country. Hearing the great news about our Pastor no longer being harassed by Cuban authorities for the church project brings great joy.

Thoughts from our first visit team members:

Shawn Alvelo: Before I had left, I had worried and pondered a lot of things. Why was I chosen to go? How could I be useful? I was scared to get out of my comfort zone, scared to see the suffering, afraid that Cuban Customs Agents would intercept the much needed supplies for our sister church, and even afraid that I would be affected and that my heart would be changed. Traveling to a country decades behind also had concerned me greatly. Looking back, it was silly. On arriving in Cuba, I saw the stark contrast with home. Getting food, work and even transportation is a constant daily life struggle. The Cubans we met were content and thankful for whatever they had, no matter how minuscule it was. They were deeply touched that we chose to visit them and pray for their wellbeing, and so thankful for the supplies our church blessed them with. The blessings from them in return were so numerous and touching, it was an amazing feeling. The Holy Spirit came upon me and over flooded my cup. I wondered ... God, why was I so special to be chosen by You and that You want a special connection with me? I am absolutely nothing and yet, here You are, knocking.... waiting for a reply, waiting for me to open the door to let you in. God I am SO SORRY that I have not focused on You! In my life, I've tried to do things that make me happy, which only led me away from You. I am sorry!" I was so touched and overcome by His Spirit and by the thought that He wanted a relationship with me, me of all people, my special pattern / my DNA, for "I was fearfully and wonderfully made..." You knew my everything and yet You still want a relationship with me..... I could not contain it and tried to (Continued from page 6)

hold back this intense emotion of Your outpouring Love and Affection, it was an amazing feeling that I will NEVER forget! I

had a similar experience at another mission site. After we prayed for the missionaries, they returned it tenfold! What an experience of the devotion and power of prayer



from them! It flowed out of them like a raging river bubbling forth in forms of prayer, protection, guidance, and the will to go where we are called. Now that we are back home, I realize it's so easy to fall back into ruts of our lives. We need to always keep our eyes on Jesus and focus on Him. We should ALWAYS remember that there is absolutely nothing that He cannot do, God provides! Hallelujah! I am so thankful for the life He has given me, that I can freely worship Him, and for the blessings we have compared to others around the world. I look forward to my next mission trip, wherever it may be, because I know God will provide and light our path. May God continue to bless us all at First Lutz, and to use us for His purposes and blessings.

Sherry Rodriguez Craig: Sherry is praising God that the lost



luggage that she was assigned to getting through Customs was found. Simple delights of God's love were experienced throughout the trip - like when we

found the missing 20th tennis ball which we took that was needed to make the teams even when we led a night of joy for the ladies at the church. The sermon preached on Sunday morning by Pastor Darier entitled "God's Got Your Back! was a stirring tribute to the blessing of God when we exercise our faith and obedience. We were all so touched and blessed to find out that the men's group of El Bon prayed on their knees on the dangerous, winding road leading in to the region of Pilon for our safe entrance and exit! God answered! And, God's timing of our flights was PERFECT getting us out of Cuba on the last afternoon of flights!

Nancy Gray: When Nancy was asked about some of the miracles she saw, she gave a response we all feel: "OTHER

THAN THE WHOLE TRIP, YOU MEAN?!! Lol! God's hand was truly all over everything and everyone. We had come close to aborting the trip. It makes me want to cry for joy! God is soooo good!"

Kirby Jackson: The first day of church was something special, and the fact that they spoke a different language was not a problem. God has



magnificent plans for each person and will not let a language barrier prevent you from learning His Word. The day that we got home and found out that we had to be in quarantine for 14 days, I was like "oh no"; but, then Shawn decided to stay at our house and has made this whole quarantine thing bearable. I thank God for that, because he is an amazing person.

Ed Owen: On Sunday morning, Pastor Darier was praising God and giving thanks for the visitors that were brought to the mission to share the bounty from God. The sanctuary is overflowing with the most jubilant praying strangers who suddenly became my brothers and sisters in prayer. There was



a feeling of overwhelming joy that released tears of joy running down my face and the presence of the Holy Spirit was in everyone's hearts. I know that the Holy Spirit had filled my

soul with love, compassion and humility like I had never known before. Since my encounter that day in El Bon, I am still reconciled with the idea that "Big Boys don't cry", but the tears of joy created by the Holy Spirit keep Satan at bay. Believe, Believe, and Believe! May the spirit of the Holy Ghost and El Bon Cuba continue to teach and bless us all.

In closing, we want to thank you again, Church, for everything and for traveling with us in our hearts!! Because of you, many lives were touched! Each time we leave, another little piece of our hearts remain there in El Bon.


