

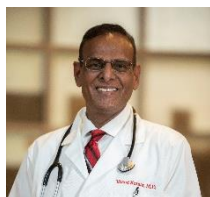

DESIRED OUTCOMES - At the conclusion of this activity, the learner will be able to:

1. Perform a thorough history/physical exam, recognizing the signs and symptoms of vascular disease
2. Recognize which patients to first send to a vascular specialist, podiatrist, or wound doctor
3. Identify how each disease ties into vascular disease
