#### PITTSBURGH PENGUINS

**All-Time Wild Record:** 16-17-2 (7-8-2 at Grand Casino Arena, 9-9-0 at Pittsburgh)

**2024-25:** Minnesota went 1-1-0 against the Penguins...The Wild won the series-opening game, 5-3, at PPG Paints Arena (10/29), and Pittsburgh earned a 3-1 win in the series finale in Saint Paul...C **Freddy Gaudreau** (2-1=3) and LW **Kirill Kaprizov** (1-2=3) led Minnesota with three points each...C **Ryan Hartman** (1-0=1) and RW **Mats Zuccarello** (1-0=1) each scored a goal...G **Marc-Andre Fleury** went 1-1-0 with a 2.55 GAA and a .900 SV%...C **Sidney Crosby** led the Penguins with five points (2-3=5)...RW **Rickard Rakell** had three points (2-1=3)...D **Kris Letang** (0-2=2) had two points...G **Joel Blomqvist** stopped 35-of-39 shots faced for Pittsburgh in the first meeting...G **Tristan Jarry** saved 29-of-30 shots faced in the second game.

**WILD LEADERS:** LW **Marcus Johansson** leads Minnesota with 25 points (10-15=25) in 44 career games against Pittsburgh...**Zuccarello** has 23 points (7-16=23) in 37 games...D **Zach Bogosian** (4-9=13, in 33 games) and RW **Vladimir Tarasenko** (4-9=13, in 21 games) have 13 points each...D **Jonas Brodin** has 12 points (3-9=12) in 20 games.

**WILD GOALIES:** G **Filip Gustavsson** is 1-3-0 with a 4.04 GAA and a .873 SV% in four games (three starts) vs. Pittsburgh...G **Jesper Wallstedt** has not faced the Penguins.

**PENGUINS LEADERS:** Crosby leads Pittsburgh with 40 points (14-26=40) in 26 career games against Minnesota...D **Erik Karlsson** owns 36 points (9-27=36) in 31 games...C **Evgeni Malkin** owns 27 points (12-15=27) in 22 matches...D **Kris Letang** (4-16=20 in 24 contests) and Rakell (13-7=20 in 34 games) own 20 points each.

**PENGUINS GOALIES:** Jarry is 4-0-1 with a 2.56 GAA and a .913 SV% in five career starts vs. the Wild...G **Arturs Silovs** has not faced Minnesota.

**CONNECTIONS:** Minnesota President of Hockey Operations and General Manager **Bill Guerin** totaled 57 points (26-31=57) in 95 games with Pittsburgh in two seasons (2008-10), winning the Stanley Cup in 2009...Guerin spent eight seasons in the Penguins' front office (2011-19), including five seasons (2014-19) as Assistant General Manager where he won two more Stanley Cups (2016, 2017)...Minnesota Head Coach **John Hynes** served as Head Coach of Wilkes-Barre Scranton for five seasons (2010-15) and one season as an Assistant Coach (2009-10)...Hynes led Wilkes-Barre to a record of 231-126-27 in 384 games (.636) and five consecutive appearances in the Calder Cup Playoffs as Head Coach...Gustavsson was selected by Pittsburgh in the second round (55th overall) of the 2016 NHL Draft...F **Vinnie Hinostroza** played in 14 games for Pittsburgh during the 2023-24 season, posting three points (1-2=3)...Crosby played at Shattuck St. Mary's (2002-03)...C **Connor Dewar** was drafted by Minnesota in the third round (No. 92 overall) of the 2018 NHL Draft and collected 38 points (18-20=38) in 173 across three seasons (2021-24) with the Wild...D **Matt Dumba** was selected seventh overall by the Wild in the 2012 NHL Draft and collected 236 points (79-157=236), 399 PIM and a plus-29 rating in 598 games in 10 seasons (2013-23) with Minnesota...C **Tommy Novak** played four seasons at the University of Minnesota (2015-19) and played high school hockey at St. Thomas Academy...C **Blake Lizotte** is from Lindstrom and played two seasons at St. Cloud State University (2017-19)...RW **Justin Brazeau** tallied two points (1-1=2) in 19 games with Minnesota last season...Wild Player Development Advisor **Alex Goligoski** was selected by Pittsburgh in the second round (No. 61 overall) of the 2004 NHL Draft and recorded 90 points (3-67=90) in 177 games across four seasons (2007-11) with the Penguins...Penguins Assistant Coach **Nick Bonino** appeared in 55 games and recorded 26 points (10-16=26) in one season (2020-21) with the Wild...Penguins Player Development Coach **Matt Cullen** was born in Virginia, Minn., played at Moorhead High School and St. Cloud State, and recorded 123 points (44-79=123) in 272 games across four seasons (2010-13, 2017-18) with the Wild.

**FAST FACTS:** Minnesota is 2-1-0 against the Penguins in the last three meetings between the two teams.

### NOTES & MILESTONES

**Team:** Leads the NHL with 14 PPG (44 PPO) and a 31.8 PP%...Through the first 11 games of a season, ranks first in franchise history in PP% and T-1st in PPG.

**Matt Boldy:** Ranks fifth in the NHL with 42 shots, T-6th with three PPG, and T-11th with six PPP (3-3=6)...Has played in 166 consecutive games dating back to 11/2/23, the 29th-longest active streak in the NHL.

**Zeev Buium:** Ranks second among NHL rookies with six assists, T-2nd with eight points (2-6=8), third with a 19:37 TOI/G average and T-7th in shots (17)...Ranks T-3rd among NHL defensemen with four PPA and five PPP (1-4=5) and T-7th in points...Per NHL Stats, is the first player in Wild history to record a point in each of the first four regular-season home games of his career, doing so from 10/11 - 10/26.

**Joel Eriksson Ek:** Leads the the NHL in faceoffs taken (243) and in faceoffs won (128).

**Brock Faber:** Owns five points (1-4=5) in his last two games...Finished with a game-high seven shots on goal vs. WPG (10/28), the second-highest single-game total of his career...Notched three assists (0-3=3) vs. SJS (10/26), tying his single-game career-high in assists and points...The total also tied the franchise single-game high for assists by a defenseman (23rd occurrence).

**Ryan Hartman:** Scored the 100th goal of his Wild career vs. SJS (10/26), becoming the 14th player in franchise history to reach the mark.

**Marcus Johansson:** Owns an active three-game goal streak (4-0=4), tied for the second-longest streak of his NHL career (four games, 2/5 - 2/11/17)...Is currently six games from 1,000 for his career.

**Kirill Kaprizov:** With a goal vs. WPG (10/28), reached 401 career points (191-210=401) and passed Zach Parise (199-201=400) for fourth-most points in franchise history...Owns an active three-game point streak (1-4=5)...Ranks T-2nd in the NHL in PPG (four) and PPP (4-4=8) and T-8th in points (6-9=15)...With three assists (0-3=3) vs. SJS (10/26), pushed his career point total to 400 (190-210=400) and tied Evgeni Malkin as the fourth-fastest active NHL player to reach the landmark, doing so in 329 games...Skated a season-high 27:08 of TOI vs. SJS (10/26), the highest total by an NHL forward this season...Notched the 10th career game with three-plus assists vs. SJS (10/26), moving past Mats Zuccarello for sole possession of second-most games in Wild history...Notched a PPA vs. SJS (10/26) to reach 139 career PPP (66-73=139) and move past Ryan Suter (21-117=138) for third-most in Wild history...Currently ranks second in franchise history with 66 career PPG (Parise, 69).

**Marco Rossi:** Owns an active three-game point streak (1-4=5) and six points 1-5=6) in his last five games.

**Jared Spurgeon:** With an assist vs. WPG (10/28), reached 300 assists for his career and joined Mikko Koivu (504 assists) and Ryan Suter (314 assists) as the only players to reach the landmark with the Wild.

**Yakov Trenin:** Leads the NHL with 51 hits this season...Currently at 99 career points (55-44=99).

## WILD AT THE OLYMPICS

Wild General Manager and President of Hockey Operations **Bill Guerin** is serving as the General Manager of the 2026 United States Men's Ice Hockey Team. He is joined on Team USA's staff by Wild Head Coach **John Hynes**, who will serve as an assistant coach; Wild Assistant General Manager **Chris Kelleher**, who will work on the management staff; Wild Head Athletic Trainer **John Worley** and Assistant Athletic Trainer and Massage Therapist **Travis Green**, who will work as athletic trainers, and Wild Orthopedic Surgeon **Joel Boyd**, who will serve as team physician.

Wild forward **Nico Sturm** was selected to Germany's preliminary roster. The native of Augsburg had eight points (six goals, two assists) in 10 games at the 2023 for silver-winning Germany at the 2023 Worlds, and he also competed at the tournament the following year.



# TEAM NOTES



## ON THE POWER PLAY

- Leads the NHL with 14 PPG (44 PPO) and a 31.8 PP%. Through the first 11 games of a season, ranks first in franchise history in PP% and T-1st in PPG.
- Scored nine consecutive power-play goals, the longest streak in franchise history and tied for the third-longest streak in the NHL since the 1933-34 season, from 10/11 - 10/14.
- Since the 1933-34 season, only the 1987-88 New York Rangers (11 PPG) recorded more power-play goals in a season's first four games. Since 1977-78, no team with 20-plus power-play opportunities recorded a higher power-play percentage.
- The Wild opened the season by scoring a power-play goal in four consecutive games, achieving the feat for the sixth time in franchise history. The run trailed only the 2010-11 season (six-game streak) and the 2022-23 season (five-game streak) for the longest season-opening runs in franchise history.



# PLAYER NOTES



## MARCO POLO

- **Marco Rossi** owns an active three-game point streak (1-4=5) and six points 1-5=6) in his last five games.
- Saw his streak of 173 consecutive regular-season games played snapped when he did not play 10/20 at NYR due to injury. The streak was the longest among Wild players and T-30th among active NHL players.
- Notched his first career shootout goal vs. LAK (10/13), the game winner.
- Opened the season with two points (1-1=2) at STL (10/9).
- Led the team in PPG (seven), ranked second in assists (36) and points (24-36=60) and third in goals (24) last season.
- Reached 101 career points with two assists (0-2=2) vs. SJS (4/9/25).
- Scored the GWG in overtime vs. DAL (4/6/25), his third GWG of the 2024-25 season.
- Notched his 30th assist of the season at COL (2/28/25) to become the second Austrian player in NHL history to reach the 30-assist mark in a single campaign (Thomas Vanek, 7x).
- Is the third Austrian player with multiple 20-goal seasons in the NHL, joining Thomas Vanek (11x) and Michael Grabner (4x). Also the third Austrian player with 50 points in a season, joining Vanek (9x) and Grabner (1x).
- Named the NHL's First Star of the Week after recording eight points (3-5=8) in three games for the period ending Jan. 5, 2025.

## TRICKS UP HIS ZEEV

- **Zeev Buium** ranks second among NHL rookies with six assists, T-2nd with eight points (2-6=8), third with a 19:37 TOI/G average and T-7th in shots (17).
- Ranks T-3rd among NHL defensemen with four PPA and five PPP (1-4=5) and T-7th in points.
- Per NHL Stats, is the first player in Wild history to record a point in each of the first four regular-season home games of his career, doing so from 10/11 - 10/26.
- Per NHL Stats, recorded his sixth career assist vs. UTA (10/25) and tied Nick Schultz for the second most by a Wild defenseman before age 20. Jonas Brodin leads the list with nine. He also became the fourth player in Wild history to record a point in each of the first three regular-season home games of his career. The others: Brent Burns (3 GP in 2003-04), Marian Gaborik (3 GP in 2000-01) and Maxim Sushinsky (3 GP in 2000-01).
- According to NHL Stats, is one of five NHL rookies since the 1933-34 NHL season to record five-plus PPP in his team's first four games.
- Finished with two points (1-1=2) and scored his first career NHL goal (Merzlikins) vs. CBJ (10/11), becoming the fourth-youngest defenseman in Wild history to score a goal (19 years, 308 days).
- Finished with a career-high 24:39 of TOI vs CBJ (10/11), joining Jonas Brodin (18 occurrences) as the only players in Wild history to post 24-plus minutes of TOI before turning 20 years old.
- Notched the first assist of his NHL career vs. VGK (4/24) to become the second-youngest player in Wild history (19 years, 138 days) to record their first Stanley Cup Playoff point, behind Pierre-Marc Bouchard (19 years, 19 days in Game 4 of 2003 CF).
- Became the 12th-youngest player (19 years, 134 days) in NHL history to make his League debut during the Stanley Cup Playoffs vs. VGK (4/20) and 152nd player overall.
- He was the 326th player (304th skater) to play in a regular-season or Stanley Cup Playoff game for the Wild.



# PLAYER NOTES

## KIRILL THE THRILL

- **Kirill Kaprizov** scored a goal vs. WPG (10/28) and reached 401 career points (191-210=401) to pass Zach Parise (199-201=400) for fourth-most points in franchise history.
- Ranks T-2nd in the NHL in PPG (four) and PPP (4-4=8) and T-8th in points (6-9=15).
- With three assists (0-3=3) vs. SJS (10/26), pushed his career point total to 400 (190-210=400) and tied Evgeni Malkin as the fourth-fastest active NHL player to reach the landmark, doing so in 329 games. Among all-time NHL players born outside of North America, Kaprizov tied Malkin as the seventh-fastest to hit 400 points. Overall, Kaprizov and Malkin are tied as the 22nd-fastest players in NHL history to reach 400 career points.

- Notched the 10th career game with three-plus assists vs. SJS (10/26), moving past Mats Zuccarello for sole possession of second-most games in Wild history.
- Notched a PPA vs. SJS (10/26) to reach 139 career PPP (66-73=139) and move past Ryan Suter (21-117=138) for third-most in Wild history.

- Currently at 210 career assists, needs nine assists to pass Marian Gaborik (218) for seventh in franchise history.
- Currently with 42 career multi-assist games, tied with Mats Zuccarello (42) for fourth-most in franchise history.
- Ranked second on the team in goals (25), third in points (25-31=56) and fourth in assists (31) in 2024-25.

## HE'S GOING STREAKING

- Kaprizov notched a point in 16-of-20 road games played in 2024-25 (11-20=31), including a franchise-record 11-game road point streak (8-16=24) from 10/15 - 11/21.

- Kaprizov posted a multi-point streak of eight games on the road (6-14=20) from 10/15 - 11/8/25, joining Steven Stamkos (8 GP in 2017-18) and Roman Josi (8 GP in 2021-22) as the only active players to achieve the mark.
- Kaprizov recorded seven-game multi-point and assist streaks (6-11=17) from 10/15 - 11/1/25.
- His streak of seven consecutive games with multiple points set a franchise record and T-4th longest in the NHL since the 2000-01 season.

## BOLDY AND THE BEAUTIFUL

- Matt Boldy** ranks fifth in the NHL with 42 shots, T-6th with three PPG, and T-11th with six PPP (3-3=6).
- Has played in 166 consecutive games dating back to 11/2/23, the 29th-longest active streak in the NHL.
- Posted a five-game point streak from 10/9-10/17, tied for the fifth-longest season-opening streak in franchise history.
- According to NHL Stats, became the sixth different Wild player to record a point in each of his team's first five games of a season.
- Posted a four-game goal streak from 10/9 - 10/14, becoming the first player in franchise history to achieve the feat in a season's first four games.
- Recorded a career-high 10 shots on goal at DAL (10/14), tied for the fourth-highest single-game total in franchise history.
- Recorded the 20th three-point game (1-2=3) of his career vs. CBJ (10/11), one shy of tying Mats Zuccarello (21) for fourth in franchise history.
- Posted three points (1-2=3) at STL (10/9), moving his career total in season-opening games to nine points (4-5=9) in four games and marking the highest PPG average (2.25) in team history.
- Led the Wild with 73 points (27-46=73), 27 goals and 46 assists and ranked second with six PPG in 2024-25.
- Established single-season career highs in games played (82), points and assists in 2024-25.
- Currently fifth in franchise history with 24 career GWG, three behind Kirill Kaprizov (27).

- Is the fourth player in franchise history to record three consecutive 60-point seasons (also Kaprizov, Koivu, Zuccarello).

- **Jared Spurgeon** recorded an assist vs. WPG (10/28) to reach 300 assists for his career and joined Mikko Koivu (504 assists) and Ryan Suter (314 assists) as the only players to reach the landmark with the Wild.
- Registered a game-high five blocked shots at NYR (10/20).
- Scored a power-play goal vs. LAK (10/13) to reach 133 career powerplay points (35-98=133) and tie Pierre-Marc Bouchard (29-104=133) for sixth-most in Wild history.
- Led Wild defensemen and ranked seventh among Wild skaters with 32 points (7-25=32) last season.
- Posted two points (1-1=2) at SEA (3/4/25) to record the 73rd multi-point game of his career and moved past Ryan Suter (72 mpg) for most multi-point games by a Wild defenseman. Now with 74 career multi-point games, ranks sixth all-time in multi-point games among all Wild skaters.
- Reached 401 career points (116-285=401) with an assist at MTL (1/30/25) and moved past Zach Parise (199-201=400) for third on the Wild's all-time points list.
- Reached 400 career points (116-284=400) with a goal at TOR (1/29/25) and became the fourth player and first defenseman to reach 400 points in a Wild sweater.
- Also notched his 23rd career game-winning goal at TOR (1/29/25), tying Eric Staal for fifth-most in franchise history.
- Played in his 900th career NHL game vs. UTA (1/23/25), joining Mikko Koivu (1,028 games) as the only players to play 900-plus games for the Wild.
- Spurgeon pushed his career TOI total to 19,726:58 with 24:08 skated at UTA (12/10/25), moving past Mikko Koivu (19,718:08 TOI) for most in franchise history.
- Ranks first in franchise history in plus-minus rating (plus-113), blocked shots (1,629) and minutes skated (20,860:58), second in games played (944), third in assists (300), third in scoring (118-300=418) and fourth in shots (1,557).
- Since entering the NHL in 2010-11, has recorded the fewest PIMs (164) by a defenseman playing in 800-plus games. Among all players with 800-plus games, he trails only teammate Marcus Johansson (160).

## THE GUS BUS IS ROLLING

- **Filip Gustavsson** is now 35-25-10 with a 2.56 GAA and a .915 SV% in road games since joining the Wild prior to the 2022-23 season. He ranks third in the NHL in road SV% and fourth in road GAA during that span (min. 50 gp).
- Posted a 26-save shutout at STL (10/9), reaching 12 for his career and tying Manny Fernandez for fourth-most in Wild history.
- Is the first goaltender in franchise history to post a shutout in multiple season openers (also 10/12/23) and is the only active goalie to accomplish the feat for any franchise.
- Is 75-51-18 in his career with the Wild since joining the franchise in 2022-23. Gustavsson ranks fourth in the NHL during that span with a .913 SV% and T-4th with 12 shutouts (min. 50 games).
- Posted a 31-19-6 record in 2024-25 and ranked T-4th in the NHL in shutouts (five), sixth in SV% (.914) and T-6th in wins.
- Is the fifth goaltender in franchise history to reach 30 wins in a single season.
- His five shutouts last season were tied for the second-highest single-season total in Wild history (Backstrom, eight in 2008-09).
- Was named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the period ending March 23, 2025, going 3-0-0 with a 0.67 goals-against average, .976 save percentage and one shutout.
- Posted a 161:49 shutout streak from 3/17 - 3/22/25, the longest home shutout streak in franchise history and the sixth-longest shutout streak in the NHL this season and in franchise history.
- Stopped a penalty shot at SEA (3/4/25) to remain a perfect 4/4 against penalty shots for his career.
- Is the fifth Swedish goaltender in NHL history to record three consecutive 20-win seasons.
- Stopped 37-of-38 shots faced to earn a win vs. CAR (2/6/25), his 63rd in his Wild career, to move past Dwayne Roloson for fourth-most in franchise history.
- Earned the NHL's Third Star of the Week for the period ending 10/20/25 after going 2-0-0, stopping 50 of 52 shots faced in two starts for a 1.00 GAA and a .962 SV%.
- Gustavsson scored the first goal of his hockey career, a power-play goal, at STL (10/15/25), becoming the first goaltender in franchise history to find the net.
- Is one of 17 goalies in NHL history to score a goal, a feat that has only been done a total 20 times.
- The play also marked the third PPG scored by a goalie in NHL history.
- He one of 11 goalies to score a goal by shooting it into an empty net (the others were the last to touch an own-goal).

## CROWN JOEL

- **Joel Eriksson Ek** leads the the NHL in faceoffs taken (243) and in faceoffs won (128).
- Scored a goal at STL (10/9) to reach 300 career points (137-163=300) and become the 11th player to reach the landmark in a Wild sweater.
- Scored the game-tying goal with 21 seconds remaining in regulation vs. ANA (4/15/25) to help the Wild clinch a postseason berth.
- Returned from injury to score four goals (4-0=4) vs. SJS (4/9/25), setting a new career-high and becoming the second player in franchise history with four-plus goals in a game (Gaborik, five goals vs. NYG, 12/20/07).
- Registered his third career hat trick vs. SJS (4/9/25), tying Zach Parise and Matt Boldy for third-most in franchise history.
- Moved his career goal total to 135 vs. SJS (4/9/25), overtaking Jason Zucker (132) for fifth-most in franchise history.
