Summary of Session's Stated Meeting on August 17, 2026

The Session met on Monday, August 17 for our monthly stated meeting. Minutes were reviewed and committee reports were received. Items of note include: setting an officer leadership retreat on January 9, 2027, and elders to begin working budgets with their committees in preparation for this year's Stewardship season to be held in November. The Session discussed the Sanctuary construction and gave approval to close the Fellowship Hall to activities through Thanksgiving and after Christmas to use the area for storage to prepare to move items back into the renovated spaces. The Session also discussed various structures of church administration, such as committee structure, the need for a Facilities Committee, and the calling of an Associate Pastor at the appropriate time. The next stated Session meeting is scheduled for Monday, September 21 at 5:30 pm.

Financial Summary Through July

Overall, FPC's financial foundation remains strong and resilient. Through the first seven months of the year, our church family continues to demonstrate remarkable faithfulness and generosity. General giving and pledge receipts are currently around 58% of our annual budget while operating expenses are just over 56%. This intentional balance has kept our general ministry fund performing ahead of initial projections, leaving our core church operations in a healthy and stable position. The Generation to Generation campaign continues to make major improvements in our ministry spaces and we are grateful for the congregation's generous contributions above and beyond their support to the annual budget. Additionally, our First Friends Preschool has successfully concluded another fruitful school year, maintaining independent operating reserves as it prepares for the upcoming fall semester.

We remain deeply grateful for your continued prayers, dedication, and cheerful giving as we faithfully minister to and care for our community. Thank you!



Renovation UPDATES

Dear Congregation,

We are pleased to share continued progress on the renovation project. Several major spaces are now being completed and returned to use.

Progress to Date

- The Sanctuary and Chancel are in the final stages of completion.
- The First Friends classrooms have been turned over to the preschool.
- Tile installation is complete in the new hallways and bathrooms.
- Classroom areas are nearing completion.
- Work is underway on the new accessible ramp and canopy.

Looking Ahead (September)

- Final details in the Sanctuary and Chancel will be completed.
- Remaining work in the classroom areas will be finished.
- Ramp and canopy work will continue, including railings and lighting
- The project team will shift toward inspections, punch-list work, and final completion.

Looking Further Ahead

- Remaining exterior and site work will be completed around the new addition.
- Bathrooms will be plumbed, lit, and finished.
- New and renovated spaces will be cleaned, inspected, and prepared for use.
- Final punch-list items will continue as the renovation moves toward completion.

Why This Renovation Matters

- This renovation supports our mission by improving accessibility, safety, and hospitality for our congregation and preschool community. When complete, the project will provide:
 - An ADA-accessible entrance and elevator
 - Improved classrooms and gathering spaces
 - Enhanced worship and audiovisual capabilities
 - Improved preschool facilities and outdoor play areas
 - Infrastructure designed to serve future generations

Thank you for your continued prayers, patience, and faithful support as construction progresses. We are grateful to see these renewed spaces beginning to serve our church and preschool community.

AN OVERNIGHT RETREAT

Sleep in the Deep offers a unique, behind-the-scenes look at how the Tennessee Aquarium cares for over 10,000 animals. Our 3rd-5th & 6th-12th grade groups will combine for a retreat trip to Chattanooga on Saturday, September 26. Younger children, at least 6 years old, are welcome with a parent volunteer. Family and friends are invited! Adult participants will have background checks and child protection training. Registration is open from now until September 11th.

- Scavenger Hunt After-Dark: Put your observation skills to the test as we roam through the exhibits at night searching for clues and unlocking fascinating facts about the Aquarium's mysterious marine life.
- Sleeping in the Deep: The highlight of the night is where our group will set up camp, settle into sleeping bags beside mesmerizing sea creatures, and watch them glide gracefully through the serene waters all around.
- Exhibit Wake-Up Call: Become part of our Animal Care team as they help ensure our animals have everything they need to start the day!
- Light Breakfast: Enjoy a light breakfast in the morning with coffee for our adults.

September Pastor-led Bible Study on Philippians

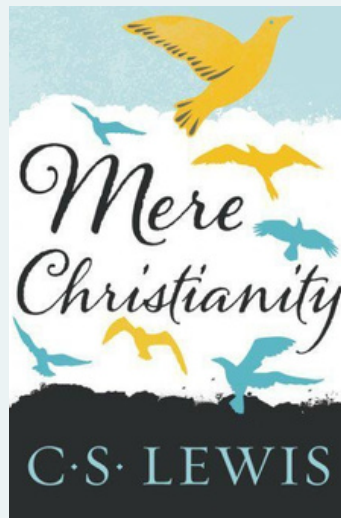
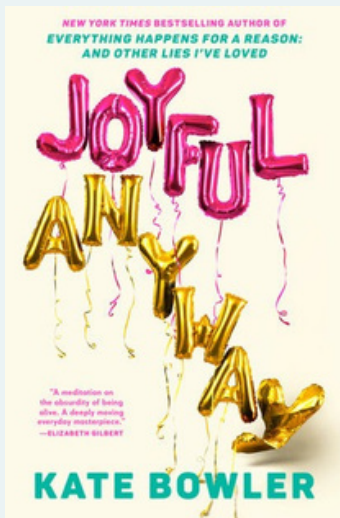

God cares for those who are struggling:

Jesus began his ministry when he was 33 years old, after spending 40 days alone in the desert. These were the very first words of his very first sermon:

"Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted." - Matthew 5

We live in a world that values those who have money, houses, cars, and possessions.

But that was not what Jesus valued. He spent his life telling his disciples to care for those who were lonely, sick, hungry, poor, and jailed. He told his followers that the

ones who were truly blessed were meek and merciful peacemakers. The work of

Jesus has been called the "upside down gospel" because everything he taught goes against what the world says is valuable, including who the world says is valuable.

Every life has meaning and purpose in God's kingdom, and that includes yours!

When you find yourself feeling sad, lonely, afraid, or rejected know that Jesus walks beside you in these times and cares for the details of your life. The kingdom of heaven is always near and through the love and grace of Jesus Christ, YOU have a place in it.

A prayer for challenging times:

Loving and Holy God, help me walk through this life knowing you walk beside me.

Help me to feel your loving presence today with the knowledge of my place in your kingdom. Forgive me for times I have fallen short of your hope for my life.

Strengthen me for the road ahead, and help me to share your love, grace and

forgiveness with those I meet along the way. In the name of your son Jesus Christ, I pray. Amen.

Supporting Kairos Limestone Prison Ministry

Kairos, or “God’s Time” uses the transforming love and forgiveness of Jesus Christ to make prisons less violent, reduce the chance of re-incarceration, and help communities on the outside become safer. Our next 3-day weekend at Alabama’s largest men’s prison, Limestone Correctional Facility, will be *October 16th -18th*.

Ways for First Presbyterian members to support this ministry include:

- Working inside prison (adult male only)
- Working just outside of prison at a nearby church (adult male and female)
- Preparing Agape in the form of food and other testaments of God’s love.
 - Children/youth make placemats and posters showing Jesus’ love
 - Adults can donate money to pay for prisoners’ individual meal tickets during that weekend and sign up for a weekend prayer vigil.
 - All can bake cookies and pray over them!

During a Kairos weekend, the atmosphere of the prison changes as we hand out cookies to prisoners and corrections staff. The prisoners see that Jesus’ people have not forgotten them, and that the Holy Spirit cannot be stopped by prison walls. So, look out for a Kairos table between services in September and October offering many ways to get involved. "Remember those in prison as if you were bound with them, and those who are mistreated as if you were suffering with them." (Hebrews 13:3)
