The organ meditations offered throughout today's service are from Josef Haydn's *The Seven Last Words of Our Saviour on the Cross* (*Die sieben letzten Worte unseres Erlösers am Kreuze*) first performed on Good Friday, 1787. These meditations provide a musical complement to each homily, offering a commentary on each of the seven sayings that transcends words. As Haydn wrote, in describing his work in a letter to his publisher, "Each text is expressed, purely by instrumental music, in such a way as to leave a profound impression [even] on the spirits of those who are hardly familiar with the subject."
