Reading

Read, Read, READ! Summer reading is vital to help your child maintain and grow as a reader! Reading during the summer also helps students foster a love for reading and lifelong learning. Keep reading over the summer to help maintain the reading level you have worked so hard for in 1st grade! We encourage students to read 30 minutes a day. We also suggest students spend time reading aloud to parents; this helps with fluency and self-correction. Make a list of the books you read over the summer so you can test on them in the fall. Look for books that are between 2.0 level and a 3.0 level.

Math

Below is a list of essential skills for your child to practice at home this summer:

- Number Sense- understanding greater than/less than, 10 more and 10 less than a number
- Place Value- Understanding how many tens and ones in a number
- Two-Digit Addition and Subtraction (no regrouping or “carrying”)
- Telling Time to the Half Hour
- Counting Coins
- Addition and Subtraction Facts- Practice facts up to 20
- Practice your addition and subtraction facts with flash cards or online. We will have weekly timed practice tests on addition and subtraction throughout the year in which they will need to complete 25 problems in 2 ½ minutes.
