

“NOT YET” – a play by Diane Germaine



“NOT YET,” the funny, acerbic, poignant two-character play about loss of independence and concerning the struggle to remain vital and visible undercurrent aging, occurs over a 4-year period in the life of Sima (89-92) and her daughter Tracy (late 50's). The turn in their relationship unfolds over 9 scenes (in two acts) and includes some read poetry, and one of the scenes is partially ad-libbed.

PERFORMANCE DATE(s): Saturday evening, September.16th (Time to-be-determined) with the possibility of a matinee earlier on Saturday.

VENUE: WWf(a)C – downstairs. *Performance proceeds to benefit Women Writing for (a) Change.*
