The 2019-20 *Casa Captivating* season includes a new music program (Casa Vibes), visual and performing arts commissions, and an expanded Casa Kids education program.

Casa Romantica also hosts a variety of free arts education programs for children year-round. Casa Romantica also offers a Summer Dance Workshop, a Spring Break Arts Week, various art, literature, and horticulture events to grades K-12, and welcomes over 6,000 children from the Capistrano Unified School District each year for STEAM-based field trips that examine the history of San Clemente and the coastal environment.
