In December, 1974, several recently resigned “married priests” met at the Beefsteak Inn (Chicago). The occasion was sparked by a comment of Auxillary Bishop Thomas Grady issued stating that men who had “left” had no interest in the Church.

Incensed by the implication, they penned a letter to the Archdiocese stating that they would return to active canonical ministry immediately if their wives were accepted as equals and their marriages were celebrated as sacred.

The letter turned into a petition; the petition turned into a national consensus; that consensus birthed CORPUS.

Forty-eight years later, we continue to herald the value of women in the church as full and equal partners. We also lament for the enormous wound in our catholic community because of their continued exclusion.

CORPUS will not cease until our message is heard and our mission completed.
