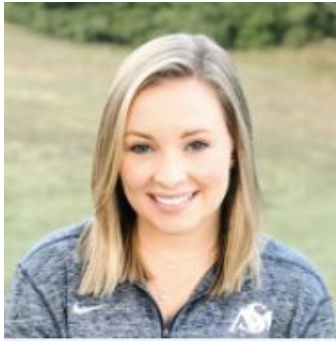


Welcome LEOS!
