Matthew 2:1-12

In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, asking, 'Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage.' When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him; and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born. They told him, 'In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet:

"And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah,

are by no means least among the rulers of Judah;

for from you shall come a ruler

who is to shepherd my people Israel."

Then Herod secretly called for the wise men and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, 'Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage.' When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure-chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.

Grow — Pray — Study

Things I'd like to remember from today's message:	

Monday, January 1 — Matthew 2:13-23

Happy New Year. Matthew's account of Jesus' birth and early years includes the escape and return from Egypt. This passage describes the kind of world into which Jesus was born. We see the contrast between the way God works and the way the world works. We also see God's guiding hand in Joseph, Mary, and Jesus' life. We see God directing Joseph through angels (messengers) who appear in his dreams. (See also Matthew 1:20.) The good news is that God still guides and directs our lives in a variety of ways.

- How has God been guiding your life recently? Are you open to God's guidance?
- Prayer: Eternal God, I confess that I too often make plans for my life and ask you to bless them. Help me learn to seek and trust your guidance. Help me learn to listen. Amen.

Tuesday, January 2 — Genesis 28:10-22

There are close to 150 references to dreams in the Bible. God's people often encountered God in their dreams and learned to look for and interpret the messages they heard. This does not mean that everything we dream is from God. But it does mean that God wants to communicate with us and uses a wide variety of means of communication. The challenge for us is to pay attention and discern God's messages. Over time, we can learn to hear God's voice amid the cacophony of the other voices we hear.

- What helps you listen for God's voice in our "noisy" world?
- Prayer: Loving God, thank you for continuing to find ways to communicate with me. Open my ears to hear the message you need me to hear today. Amen.

Wednesday, January 3 — Genesis 37:1-11

In many editions of the Bible, the heading for today's reading is, *Joseph Dreams of Greatness*. The entire story of Joseph's life (Genesis 37-50) is a story of greatness. The point of Genesis 37 is not that Joseph dreamed of greatness for himself, but that God dreamed of greatness for Joseph — according to God's wisdom and plan for God's people. This is an important distinction. All too often, we are focused on our dreams, not on God's dreams for us.

- As the New Year begins, ask God to reveal God's dreams for you for 2024. Be open to the possibility that God wants to do something new in your life this year.
- Prayer: God of Hope, thank you for bringing me through the previous year. Thank you for fresh possibilities in the year to come.
 Give me the courage I need to trust you fully. Amen.

Thursday, January 4 — 2 Corinthians 5:16-21

In the birth, life, ministry, death, and resurrection of Jesus, God changes es everything. We may struggle to understand how God changes our lives and the world around us, but the transformation God desires begins when we dare to believe that, "if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new!" (2 Corinthians 5:17). As we begin a new year, we have an opportunity to let the old pass away so that God can do something new in the days, weeks, and months ahead.

- How might you let "everything old" pass away and look for signs that "everything has become new"?
- Prayer: God of New Creations, forgive me for failing to trust in your promises. Help me believe that in Christ, I am a new creation.
 Make everything new in 2024. Amen.

Friday, January 5 — Jeremiah 31:31-34

The new covenant promised in Jeremiah 31 has deep meaning for us and is worthy of our attention as a new year begins. It reminds us that God makes and keeps covenants. The terms of God's covenant are simple. God says, "I will be your God; you will be my people" (Jeremiah 31:33). It also reminds us that God is a forgiving God, even when we fail to live up to our side of the covenant. We can always start all over with God. That's good news for any time of the year.

- Let this be one of your theme verses this year. "For the Lord is good; his steadfast love endures forever, and his faithfulness to all generations." (Psalm 100:5).
- Prayer: Forgiving God, create in me a clean heart, and put a new and right spirit within me. Close the gap between the person I am and the person I need to be. Amen.

Saturday, January 6 — Matthew 2:1-12

Today is Epiphany, the day most Christians commemorate the visit of the Magi to the Holy Family. It brings the Christmas season to a close. Our reading from Matthew 2 makes several points about the meaning of Jesus' birth, but most importantly, it reminds us that the story of Jesus is driven and directed by God. While we may not follow a star like the Magi, we can trust in God's presence and God's guidance in our lives. The challenge is to pay attention and to trust in God's promises.

- When and where do you have the most intimate experiences of God's presence? How might you cultivate your sense of God's presence and seek God's guidance for 2024 (and beyond)?
- Prayer: Ever-Present God, thank you for guiding my life. Help me learn to pay attention to you at all times. Increase my awareness of your presence in my life this week. Amen.
