Reading from the New Testament

Hebrews 11:1-3, 11-16

Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen. Indeed, by faith our ancestors received approval. By faith we understand that the worlds were prepared by the word of God, so that what is seen was made from things that are not visible.

By faith he received power of procreation, even though he was too old—and Sarah herself was barren—because he considered him faithful who had promised. Therefore from one person, and this one as good as dead, descendants were born, "as many as the stars of heaven and as the innumerable grains of sand by the seashore."

All of these died in faith without having received the promises, but from a distance they saw and greeted them. They confessed that they were strangers and foreigners on the earth, for people who speak in this way make it clear that they are seeking a homeland. If they had been thinking of the land that they had left behind, they would have had opportunity to return. But as it is, they desire a better country, that is, a heavenly one. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God; indeed, he has prepared a city for them.

This is the Word of God, for us, the People of God. Thanks be to God.

Grow — Pray — Study

Monday, Aug 18 — Hebrews 1:1-4

This week we uniquely explore passages of <u>The Letter to the Hebrews</u> (but you are encouraged to read all of it!). As we begin, we note that the introductory verses are altogether different from the letters of the NT, leading us to observe: this is not so much a letter but a *sermon*, a very adept exhortation to confidence in Christ.

- Hebrews 1 claims that Christ is "the exact representation of God's being" who has created all things, and now sustains at the throne of God all that lives. When you think of Jesus, alive right now, what images come to mind?
- Prayer: Lord Jesus, I can sometimes imagine your life in Galilee.
 But today, grant me a vision of your oneness with God, and your care for all that you have co-created. Amen.

Tuesday, Aug 19 — Hebrews 2:1-1-4

The Church has never agreed on whether Paul or another wrote this 'sermon,' but what is clear is that the author is a master of Greek language. Many elements are completely unique in all the NT, including his (or her) use of the verb translated "drift away" in 2:1. A nautical term, the word connotes a boat that has missed its moorings and is at risk of being lost to the current.

- If those first addressed were at risk of "drifting away" from the saving message of Jesus, from what essential elements are we in danger of failing to 'tie onto' today? And you?
- Prayer: Lord, there is so much I do not understand about this world, and about the Kingdom of God. Breathe into me today what will sustain my trust in you. Amen.

Wednesday, Aug 20 — Hebrews 4:14-16

This essential passage features Jesus Christ as a high priest like no other before, interceding for us with God as one who has lived our life and died our death. Note the hopeful conclusion this enables the author to reach for all who confess faith in Christ.

- If you imagine approaching God, do you have confidence you will be met with empathy and understanding? If not, you may! If so, you might consider our basis to do so.
- Prayer: Son of God, today I thank you for interceding for me, and for all humankind. You are the mainstay of my life, showing mercy and grace in my seasons of need. Amen.

Thursday, Aug 21 — Hebrews 6:4-12

Yet again, the writer shows concern for 2nd Gen Christians who are at risk of falling away from their devotion to Christ and his community. Strong encouragement is offered to those who hold to the diligent community of love and service in Jesus' name

- What to you does lethargy among Christian believers look like? What characterizes a life and a community that tie all hope and trust to the mainstay of Christ Jesus?
- Prayer: Holy Spirit, awaken in me the joy of salvation, of purpose, of selfless love, that I can leaven the loaf of my family, your Church, and the world. Amen.

Friday, Aug 22 — Hebrews 10:19-25

In a key passage, the author builds courageously on the prior exploration of Jesus as our interceding Priest in the heavenly sanctuary.

- Why would Christians in love with God ever "neglect to meet together"? How have you been enticed not "to hold fast to your moorings" in God's hopeful community?
- Prayer: Eternal God, we are so far from what we can be, are called by you to become. But because of your Son, interceding for us, what we may become gives me hope. Amen.

Saturday, Aug 23 — Hebrews 11:4-12

We think that Hebrews addressed Jewish Christians in or near Rome, as persecution was just beginning. Observe how the author urges a new perspective on trials that come owing to faithfulness to the Gospel: by these, the slackening spirit of faltering disciples may be revived (v.12)!

- As asked last week, contemplating the trials you have known in life, how were you shaped by them? Did any make of you a more faithful follower of Jesus? How, or why?
- Prayer: Lord Christ, very little persecution comes to Christians in McLean – at least, not to those like me. But open my eyes to my neighbors at risk, and straighten my path as I come beside them. Amen.
