Monday, June 12 — Exodus 19:1-9

God's covenant with Israel is one of the central themes of the Old Testament. The terms of the covenant are established by God. (They are not negotiable, no matter how hard humanity tries to change them.) What God says is simple: I will be your God; you will be my people. Our challenge is to understand what it means to be God's covenant people. We find one clue in Exodus 19:6, where God promises that Israel will be a "priestly kingdom and a holy nation." This means that God's covenant people are expected to serve God's purposes in the world.

- In Genesis 12:2-3, the terms of the covenant are stated like this: "I (God) will bless you ... so that you will be a blessing.... In you all the families of the earth shall be blessed." How have you experience God's covenant in your life? Do you see God's blessings in your life as an obligation to be a blessing to others?
- Prayer: Covenant-making God, thank you for pouring out your many blessings in my life. Show me how to serve your purposes in the world and be a blessing to others. Amen.

Tuesday, June 13 — Isaiah 40:25-31

The people for whom Isaiah was writing were experiencing discouragement, and exhaustion – not unlike many people in our world, including many of us. They complained to God about their situation fand eared that God had abandoned them. Like us, they needed to be reminded that God is the ultimate promise-keeper. Unlike them (and us) Isaiah says, God does not grow "faint or grow weary" and if Israel (and we) will trust God, then they (and we) will experience the fullness of God's power: they (and we) "shall mount up with wings like eagles" (Isaiah 40:31).

- When have you experienced discouragement and/or exhaustion?
 How have those feelings affected your relationship with God?
 What helps you experience the fullness of God's power?
- Prayer: Eternal God, when I am discouraged and exhausted, when I have doubts and fears, remind me of your great promises.
 Help me experience the fullness of your power. Amen.

Wednesday, June 14 — Luke 5:1-11

Simon Peter, the former fisherman from Capernaum, was the leader of, and often the spokesman for, the twelve apostles. He and the Apostle Paul were two of the primary leaders in the early church. In the first century Peter became the first Bishop of Rome, which means that he was the very first pope. The encounter with Jesus described in Luke 5 was a life-changing experience for Peter. He answered Jesus' call (despite his protest that he was unworthy) and he left everything behind to follow Jesus. As a result he shared in Jesus' ministry of "catching people."

When and how have you had life-changing encounters with Jesus? Have you experienced a call to live a new life? How has Jesus called you to share in his earthly ministry?

Prayer: Living God, help me follow the example of Peter and answer Jesus' call to be his disciple. Transform my life so that I can serve your purposes in the world today. Amen.

Thursday, June 15 — Luke 22:24-34

Even though he was a leader among Jesus' disciples (see Matthew 16:18-19), Peter was a fallible human being. At times he was bold and brash, exuding confidence. But at the crucial moment in Jesus' life, Peter would fail to admit that he even knew Jesus. However, Peter's failure did not mean that he would not – and could not – faithfully serve Jesus. Note that Jesus is confident that Peter would turn back after his failure. Note also that when Peter "turned back", Jesus expected him to lead the others.

- Have you ever believed that your failures exclude you from following and serving Jesus? Can you accept that God forgives you and has plans for your life?
- Prayer: God of Grace, forgive me for the many times I have failed to be the person you want me to be. Help me to turn back and do what you expect of me. Amen.

Friday, June 16 — Acts 3:1-10

After Jesus' ascension into heaven (Acts 1:1-11), Peter and the other disciples of Jesus continued Jesus' ministry on earth. Just as the power of God worked through Jesus to heal and forgive a paralyzed man (Luke 5:17-26), the power of God worked through Peter and John to heal a lame man at the gate of the temple. The coming of the Holy Spirit into the lives of Jesus' disciples empowered them – and still empowers us – to experience God's power to change the world.

- Are you willing to allow God's power to work in your life? How is God empowering you to make a difference in the world around you? What is God empowering you to do today?
- Prayer: Almighty God, send your Holy Spirit into my life again today. I'm willing to be an instrument of your grace and peace. Use me to change the world today. Amen.

Saturday, June 17 — 1 Peter 4:8-11

The first letter of Peter calls upon Jesus' followers to be good stewards of the grace of God and serve others with the gifts God has given them. It also calls upon Jesus' followers to use the strength that God supplies, so that God will be glorified. This is a powerful reminder that the grace and power we receive and enjoy comes from God, not because we are good and deserve God's blessings, but because God is good. We are blessed, so that can bless others in God's name.

- Are you ever tempted to rely on your own power and your own best intentions when you are serving God? How might you learn to rely on God's grace and God's power in your life?
- Prayer: Merciful God, grant me the courage I need to trust in your grace and your power today. Help me learn to serve you with the gifts and with the strength that you supply. Amen.
