Scripture Deuteronomy 26:1-10 Taehwan Roh

When you have come into the land that the Lord your God is giving you as an inheritance to possess, and you possess it, and settle in it, you shall take some of the first of all the fruit of the ground, which you harvest from the land that the Lord your God is giving you, and you shall put it in a basket and go to the place that the Lord your God will choose as a dwelling for his name. You shall go to the priest who is in office at that time, and say to him, 'Today I declare to the Lord your God that I have come into the land that the Lord swore to our ancestors to give us.' When the priest takes the basket from your hand and sets it down before the altar of the Lord your God, you shall make this response before the Lord your God: 'A wandering Aramean was my ancestor; he went down into Egypt and lived there as an alien, few in number, and there he became a great nation, mighty and populous. When the Egyptians treated us harshly and afflicted us, by imposing hard labour on us, we cried to the Lord, the God of our ancestors; the Lord heard our voice and saw our affliction, our toil, and our oppression. The Lord brought us out of Egypt with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm, with a terrifying display of power, and with signs and wonders; and he brought us into this place and gave us this land, a land flowing with milk and honey. So now I bring the first of the fruit of the ground that you, O Lord, have given me.' You shall set it down before the Lord your God and bow down before the Lord your God.

Grow — Pray — Study

Things I'd like to remember from today's message:	

Monday, October 30 — Leviticus 2:1-10

From beginning to end, the Bible is a book that describes worship as the primary way God's creation relates to God. The Book of Leviticus begins with several chapters of instructions about worship, beginning with the offerings that worshippers bring to God. In this context, an "offering" is not just a sacrificed animal, it describes any gift "offered" to God as an act of worship. The point is that, through our offerings — which are something valuable to us — we acknowledge in a tangible way that God is giver of life.

- Spend some time this week reflecting on how you respond to God's blessings in your life. Do you see your offerings, given to God through the Church, as an act of worship? If not, how do you see them?
- Prayer: God of Creation, I confess that I often forget that my offerings are an act of worship. Help me remember that I give in response to what you have given me. Amen.

Tuesday, October 31 — Deuteronomy 12:5-7

Deuteronomy is a book of laws guiding the life of the Israelites. It covers many topics, some in great detail. Much of the book is about how the Israelites are to worship God. In chapter 12, they are told not to worship in the way the pagans (non-believers) worship, but to worship God with offerings, sacrifices, tithes, and donations (verse 6). The message seems clear: the primary way the Israelites related to God is through worship, and the primary way the Israelites worshipped was to bring their tithes and offerings and offer thanks and praise to God.

- What do you think about how Leviticus and Deuteronomy describe worship? How do you feel about how Leviticus and Deuteronomy describe worship?
- Prayer: Generous God, inspire in me a willingness to obey your commands to worship you through my tithes and offerings. Teach me to give freely and without reservation. Amen.

Wednesday, November 1 — Deuteronomy 26:1-10

The instructions about worship in Deuteronomy culminates in chapter 26. It guides much of what we believe about how we worship today. First, we remember what God has done (verses 5-9). Then, we bring the first fruits as an act of worship (verse 10). Our 21st century worship service may vary from the Deuteronomy 26 model, but when we gather as a community of believers, we remember what God has done by reading the Bible and telling the story of Jesus, and we respond by giving the first fruits of our lives — time, talent, and financial treasure — to God, in response to what God has done.

- Deuteronomy emphasizes that the offerings brought to God are the first fruits, not what is leftover. Give honest and prayerful thought to how you prepare your offering to God. Do you bring first fruits?
- Prayer: God of Grace, too often my words and actions do not match. I say that you have first place in my life, but I give you what's leftover. Forgive my selfishness today. Amen.

Thursday, November 2 — Deuteronomy 26:10b-15

Tithing is the Biblical standard for offerings given to God. A tithe is ten percent, and according to Deuteronomy 26, it is the first ten percent, offered to God as a response to God's grace. There are two things to notice. First, that the tithe is used to feed the people who need the community's support. Widows and orphans would have been completely dependent on the community's obedience to God's commands. Second, the tithe was explicitly part of the confession of faith. "I have removed the sacred portion from the house, and I have given it to ..." (verse 14).

- Tithing is proportional giving; a percentage of what God has given us. What proportion of what you've received do you return to God as an act of worship and obedience?
- Prayer: God of Great Expectations, thank you for challenging me to meet the high expectations you have for your children. Help me grow in faith and obedience. Amen.

Friday, November 3 — Matthew 6:1-4

In the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5 - 7), Jesus challenges his disciples (and the potential disciples who are listening to his message) to practice their piety (their spiritual disciplines) for the right reasons. Giving alms is one of the three spiritual disciplines he mentions. (Alms are material donations to people in need.) Jesus insists that giving alms (and praying and fasting) was to be done in secret, without thought for reward or recognition. We give alms because it pleases and honors. Jesus' point was simple: we worship and honor God when we use our resources to help others.

- In what ways have you put Jesus' teaching into practice? Have you helped or cared for someone without expecting to be recognized? What was that experience like for you?
- Prayer: Merciful God, it is easy to be generous for the wrong reasons. Help me to accept and follow Jesus' teaching for its own sake, not for recognition or reward. Amen.

Saturday, November 4 — 2 Corinthians 9:10-15

The 8th and 9th chapters of 2 Corinthians are about the collection Paul is receiving to support the church in Jerusalem. He uses every tactic he can to inspire their generosity. He insists that their generosity is a response to God's generosity and that they themselves will be blessed when they bless others. Then he says that, not only will their generosity meet the needs of the saints (in Jerusalem), but it is also an act of thanksgiving to God. In other words, their generosity is an act of worship.

- There are many reasons to give time, talent, and financial treasure to God through the church. Why do you give? Why are you generous?
- Prayer: Eternal God, thank you for your great generosity to me.
 Thank you for sending Jesus, so that I can be saved from sin and death. I give my whole to you today. Amen.


