For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil, and in their eagerness to be rich some have wandered away from the faith and pierced themselves with many pains.

Grow — Pray — Study

Things I'd like to remember from today's message:	

Monday, November 6 — Deuteronomy 8:1-20

The warning, "do not forget the LORD your God," (Deuteronomy 8:11) was specifically for the Israelites as they entered the beauty and bounty of the promised land. They would be tempted to forget that it was God who had saved them and start to believe they had earned and even deserved their freedom. Like the Israelites, we are also easily tempted to forget God and take undue credit for our accomplishments — especially when life is good. Generosity, as an act of worship, reminds us that God is the source of all that is good. When we tithe, we give God the first fruits of God's bounty and in doing so, we give God first place in our lives.

- What helps you keep your life in order? What helps you put God first in everything you do?
- Prayer: God of History, help me be more aware of the temptations of success. Teach me how to put my life in order. Teach me how to keep you in first place in all things. Amen.

Tuesday, November 7 — Matthew 6:25-34

In the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5-7), Jesus covers many topics under the primary heading of "greater righteousness" (Matthew 5:20). God, Jesus insists, has high expectations for citizens of the Kingdom of Heaven. These high expectations include one of the most difficult commands in the Bible, "do not worry" (Matthew 6:25, 28, 31, 34). Jesus says that the antidote to worry is getting our priorities in order: "strive first for the kingdom of God and his righteousness" and everything else will fall into place (Matthew 6:33).

- What is the cost of worry in your life right now? In what ways does
 worry (in all its forms) interfere with your ability to experience joy
 and peace and contentment? What might you do this week to
 reduce the impact of worry in your life?
- Prayer: God of Peace, thank you for the teaching and example of Jesus, who made your Kingdom his highest priority. Show me how to reduce worry and follow him today. Amen.

Wednesday, November 8 — Matthew 22:34-40

During his final week (before the crucifixion) Jesus was tested many times by religious leaders who wanted to trick him into saying something that would make it easier for them to get rid of him. One of the questions was, "which commandment in the law is the greatest?" (Matthew 22:56). Jesus' response was taken from Deuteronomy 6:5 and Leviticus 19:18. Not only did he silence his critics (temporarily) he provided essential guidance for us. We now have a better understanding of God's highest priorities for our lives and for the world: loving God and loving our neighbors.

- Do you agree with Jesus' answer to the question about the greatest commandment? What is the most important commandment for you?
- Prayer: Gracious God, forgive me for resisting your teaching about the greatest commandment. Give me the courage I need to both follow and obey your Son. Amen.

Thursday, November 9 — 2 Corinthians 8:1-7

According to Galatians 2:1-10, Paul describes his relationship with the other apostles and the beginning of his ministry. He says that the "only thing" they asked of him was to "remember the poor" (Galatians 2:10). The offering he went on to collect for the saints (and the poor) in Jerusalem was one of the ways he fulfilled that promise. He asked the Corinthians to follow the example of the Macedonians and make this a priority in their life and ministry. Paul was clear that the Apostles' priorities should be reflected in the church's actions — the generosity of their financial giving.

- What priorities are revealed in the way you use your time, your talents, and your financial treasure? What, if anything, is God leading you to change at this time in your life?
- Prayer: Eternal God, I know that the way I use time, talent, and treasure reveals my priorities. Help me align my priorities with yours so that I can put first things first. Amen.

Friday, November 10 — Philippians 3:12-16

The Bible does not use language of success the way we do in the 21st century. But the Apostle Paul draws on athletic images to exhort the Philippians to follow his own example and "press on toward the goal for the prize of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus" (Philippians 3:14). We can easily imagine a runner giving their all to cross the finish line and understand Paul's message. If our goal is the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus, then we will set aside everything that might hold us back and marshal all our resources (time, talent, treasure) to get there.

- Is your ultimate life goal the same as the Apostle Paul's? If not, what is it? If you share Paul's goal, how have you focused your attention and your efforts to get there?
- Prayer: God of Heaven and Earth, shine your light into my life so that I can see clearly where you want me to go. Help me discern your goals for my life today. Amen.

Saturday, November 11 — 1 Timothy 6:2b-10

Just as Jesus was tempted by the trappings of success and glory (see Matthew 4:1-11 and Luke 4:1-12) we are easily tempted (and tested) by the lure of the world's definitions of success and glory — the world's definition for living a good life. Timothy is instructed to warn people not to wander away from the faith and to prioritize godliness and contentment. Generosity (of time, talent, and treasure) is one of the primary ways we can resist the lures of success and glory. Generosity helps us grow in both godliness and contentment.

- Spend some time thinking about how the way you use your time, talent, and treasure does or does not reflect your priorities. Where might God be leading you to change?
- Prayer: God of Love, thank you for helping me resist the temptations of success and glory that lead me away from you. Increase my ability to trust your priorities for my life. Amen.



Agnus Dei: "Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world: give them rest. O Lord, may everlasting light shine on them with your saints forever, for you are merciful."
