Reading from the New Testament

Colossians 2:6-15

As you therefore have received Christ Jesus the Lord, continue to walk in him, rooted and built up in him and established in the faith, just as you were taught, abounding in thanksgiving.

Watch out that no one takes you captive through philosophy and empty deceit, according to human tradition, according to the elemental principles of the world, and not according to Christ. For in him the whole fullness of deity dwells bodily, and you have come to fullness in him, who is the head of every ruler and authority. In him also you were circumcised with a spiritual circumcision, by the removal of the body of the flesh in the circumcision of Christ; when you were buried with him in baptism, you were also raised with him through faith in the power of God, who raised him from the dead. And when you were dead in trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, God made you alive together with him, when he forgave us all our trespasses, erasing the record that stood against us with its legal demands. He set this aside, nailing it to the cross. He disarmed the rulers and authorities and made a public example of them, triumphing over them in it.

This is the Word of God, for us, the People of God. Thanks be to God.

Grow — Pray — Study

Notes from today's message:	

Monday, July 28 — John 15:1-11

Jesus calls himself the true vine and urges his disciples to remain in him. The image is deeply relational and organic: life, growth, and fruit-fulness all depend on staying connected to Christ. "Apart from me you can do nothing," Jesus says. The spiritual life is not about occasional inspiration but ongoing abiding. This passage reflects Paul's call to the Colossians to be "rooted and built up in him." As we remain in Christ, we are not only strengthened—we are filled with joy.

- In what ways are you staying connected to Jesus in your daily life?
- Prayer: Jesus, true vine, help me remain in you. Let your life flow through me. Prune what is fruitless, and grow in me what brings joy to you. Amen.

Tuesday, July 29 — Psalm 1:1-6

This psalm describes the person who delights in God's law as being "like a tree planted by streams of water." Such a person is fruitful, steady, and resistant to withering. The imagery mirrors the call to be rooted in Christ. But notice: the strength of the tree lies in what it's rooted in. The psalm challenges us to consider what shapes our thoughts, habits, and desires. Rootedness is not passive—it's a daily discipline of choosing where to dwell.

- What are you rooted in right now? Of what might you need to let go?
- Prayer: Faithful God, plant me beside your streams of life. Let my thoughts and actions be nourished by your Word. Keep me from walking in ways that dry up my soul. Amen.

Wednesday, July 30 — Colossians 1:15-23

Paul paints a majestic portrait of Christ: the image of the invisible God, the head of the Church, the one through whom all things were created and reconciled. This is the foundation for his later statement that "in Christ all the fullness of God dwells." We need this high view of Jesus to resist lesser substitutes. Knowing who Christ truly is keeps us from chasing what is shallow. The more we grasp Christ's sufficiency, the more we can live in gratitude and peace.

- How does seeing the greatness of Christ reshape your confidence and priorities?
- Prayer: Glorious Christ, open my eyes to your fullness. Help me trust in your sufficiency and live with a heart anchored in who you are. Amen.

Thursday, July 31 — Ephesians 4:11-16

Paul speaks of the church being built up in Christ, growing into maturity, "no longer tossed to and fro by every wind of doctrine." False teaching isn't always obvious. It often looks wise or spiritual—but it pulls us away from Christ. That's why spiritual maturity isn't just about knowledge, but about deepening our connection to Jesus. When we are grounded in him, we can speak truth in love, serve with humility, and grow together in unity.

- Where do you sense God calling you to grow in spiritual maturity?
- Prayer: God of wisdom, keep me from being swayed by every voice. Ground me in your truth. Grow your Church in love, unity, and faithfulness to Christ. Amen.

Friday, August 1 — Romans 6:1-11

Paul describes what it means to be united with Christ in his death and resurrection. Just as Christ died to sin and lives to God, so too we are called to consider ourselves "dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus." This is more than a metaphor—it's an invitation to live a new identity. The old self is gone. A new life has begun. Our confidence comes not from trying harder, but from believing what God has already done in Christ.

- What does it mean for you today to live "alive to God" in Christ?
- Prayer: God of Resurrection, thank you for the new life I have in Christ. Let me walk as someone set free—not by effort, but by your grace. Amen.

Saturday, August 2 — Colossians 2:6-15

Today's reading echoes Sunday's message: we have received Christ—now we are called to walk in him, rooted, built up, and overflowing with gratitude. Paul reminds us that in Christ, we are already full. The debt of sin is canceled. The power of evil is broken. The gospel is not something we graduate from—it is what we live in every day. This passage invites us to stay grounded in the good news and trust in Christ's victory, especially when life feels uncertain.

- How might you live differently today knowing Christ is enough?
- Prayer: Jesus, thank you that you are enough. Root me deeply in your love. Let me live with gratitude, courage, and faith in your finished work. Amen.
