This is the reason that I Paul am a prisoner for Christ Jesus for the sake of you Gentiles— for surely you have already heard of the commission of God's grace that was given to me for you, and how the mystery was made known to me by revelation, as I wrote above in a few words, a reading of which will enable you to perceive my understanding of the mystery of Christ. In former generations this mystery was not made known to humankind, as it has now been revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit: that is, the Gentiles have become fellow-heirs, members of the same body, and sharers in the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel.

Of this gospel I have become a servant according to the gift of God's grace that was given to me by the working of his power. Although I am the very least of all the saints, this grace was given to me to bring to the Gentiles the news of the boundless riches of Christ, and to make everyone see what is the plan of the mystery hidden for ages in God who created all things; so that through the church the wisdom of God in its rich variety might now be made known to the rulers and authorities in the heavenly places. This was in accordance with the eternal purpose that he has carried out in Christ Jesus our Lord, in whom we have access to God in boldness and confidence through faith in him. I pray therefore that you may not lose heart over my sufferings for you; they are your glory.

Monday, September 26 — Ephesians 1:3-6

The Letter of the Ephesians describes the Church, the community of believers, in more than one way. In the opening verses, we discover that we have been adopted by God and, by God's grace, are now God's children. This makes us part of God's family — a meaningful description of the Church. It means that we are brothers and sisters. Being adopted means we have been chosen by God. That is truly a blessing.

- What does it mean to you that God has adopted you into God's family? How does being one of God's children impact your life?
 What difference does it make for you?
- Prayer: Loving God, thank you for adopting me into your family and making me one of your children. Help me to always remember who I am and whose I am. Amen.

Tuesday, September 27 — Ephesians 3:1-13

In the letter to the Ephesians, we discover that one of God's highest priorities is to bring Gentiles and Jews together into one family. The words in chapter 3 are directed to Gentile believers who, by God's grace, are now members of God's family. The language is familiar. Gentiles, along with all of God's adopted children (Ephesians 1:5) are now *heirs*. With first-century Gentiles, we share in the inheritance of the redemption that God promises for God's own people (Ephesians 1:14).

- What do you think about being one of God's heirs? Do you look forward to the inheritance that God has promised you? Will you accept it? Will you claim your place in God's family.
- Prayer: God of Grace, the promise of redemption is a wonderful gift. It's a gift I do not deserve. Today, I accept your grace and claim my place in your family. Amen.

Wednesday, September 28 — Romans 8:12-17

The New Testament way of describing followers of Jesus as children of God continues in the Letter to the Romans. Romans 8:17, however, takes it a step further, saying that we are "joint heirs with Christ". Even though Jesus has a unique role as God's Son, the Word made flesh (John 1:14), he is still a child of God — like us. As Jesus' followers, we obey his teaching, and we follow his example. Like him, we are filled with God's Spirit, and we share his ministry. As a result, we look forward to eternal glory, with Jesus in heaven, which is the inheritance God promises to God's children.

- Think today about your relationship with God and your relationship with Jesus. How are they connected? What does it mean for you to be a "joint [heir] with Christ"? How does being labeled as one of God's heirs change your life?
- Prayer: Eternal Father, I am humbled to be a member of your family and to be a joint heir with Christ. Help me to accept and wear that label – and live my life accordingly. Amen.

Thursday, September 29 — Titus 3:1-7

Our relationship with God is supposed to affect the way we live our lives. This is one of the primary threads that runs through the New Testament. Who we are (as children of God) and how we live our lives in the world cannot be separated. The third chapter of Titus makes that connection. It says that at one time, when we were separated from God, we were foolish, disobedient, and had been led astray, ... etc. But being saved by God's mercy changed everything. We don't earn our inheritance by changing our lives. Our lives are changed by the inheritance we are promised.

- Sometimes it is hard for us to accept that we are saved by God's grace and not by our good works. What helps you remember that you haven't earned your inheritance? What helps you accept the wonderful gift that God offers you through Jesus?
- Prayer: Gracious God, forgive me for the ways I try to earn salvation through good works. Help me to trust learn that salvation is a gift and to accept your gift every day. Amen.

Friday, September 30 — James 2:1-7

Being a member of God's family means that we have all kinds of brothers and sisters. James warns us about the danger of showing partiality, of making distinctions that God does not make. The point is that we are part of God's family because of God's love and grace. God is the one who brings us together and expects that we will love one another (James 2:8) and follow the teaching and example of Jesus who loved and welcomed everyone — including the least, last, and the lost.

- How do you respond to James' teaching about the danger of showing partiality. Can you take some time to honestly reflect on your life? Where do you need to grow?
- Prayer: Almighty God, open my eyes, ears, mind, and heart to see people the way you see them — as your beloved children. Help me love them the way you love them. Amen.

Saturday, October 1 — Revelation 21:1-7

The penultimate chapter of the Bible describes the amazing inheritance that God offers his children. As you read this passage notice the breadth of God's promises: a holy city; the promise of God's presence; the end of death, mourning, crying, and pain; and a new creation. God is "making all things new" (Revelation 21:5). This is the inheritance God promises to give us.

- Read Revelation 21:1-7 once again. If this sounds like something you want, accept the gift of salvation today.
- Prayer: Merciful God, I confess that I am a sinner who can only be saved by your grace. In faith, I accept the gift of salvation you offer through your amazing grace. Amen.
