Reading from the Scriptures

Luke 14:1, 12-24 Norah Whittington

One Sabbath, when Jesus went to eat in the house of a prominent Pharisee, he was being carefully watched. Then Jesus said to his host, "When you give a luncheon or dinner, do not invite your friends, your brothers or sisters, your relatives, or your rich neighbors; if you do, they may invite you back and so you will be repaid. But when you give a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind, and you will be blessed. Although they cannot repay you, you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous."

When one of those at the table with him heard this, he said to Jesus, "Blessed is the one who will eat at the feast in the kingdom of God!"

Jesus replied: "A certain man was preparing a great banquet and invited many guests. At the time of the banquet he sent his servant to tell those who had been invited, 'Come, for everything is now ready.'

"But they all alike began to make excuses. The first said, 'I have just bought a field, and I must go and see it.

Please excuse me.'

"Another said, 'I have just bought five yoke of oxen, and I'm on my way to try them out. Please excuse me."

"Still another said, 'I just got married, so I can't come.'

"The servant came back and reported this to his master. Then the owner of the house became angry and ordered his servant, 'Go out quickly into the streets and alleys of the town and bring in the poor, the crippled, the blind and the lame!'

"'Sir,' the servant said, 'what you ordered has been done, but there is still room.'

"Then the master told his servant, 'Go out to the roads and country lanes and compel them to come in, so that my house will be full. I tell you, not one of those who were invited will get a taste of my banquet."

This is the Word of God, for us, the People of God. Thanks be to God.

The Great Thanksgiving

Grow — Pray — Study

Monday, September 8 — Luke 14:1-14

We've been told over the years that "context is everything." As we read the Bible, context certainly does matter! Observe what immediately precedes the Parable of the Wedding Banquet.

- What connection do you make of Jesus' fracturing of religious norms and the cheeky advice he then gives his host and fellow diners? And why is this odd inversion of social customs specifically called a *Parable*?
- Prayer: Lord, we often see others who aspire to rank and privilege as conniving or insecure. But today, help me instead to see myself at the table, judging others. Amen.

Tuesday, September 9 — Luke 14:15-24

In the Parable of the Great Banquet, comical excuses by would-be guests mask the profound offense caused to the Host. But his response is quite unwarranted - and wonderfully unexpected!

- How do we make excuses at times when the demands of the Gospel come our way?
- Prayer: Lord Jesus, I get the sense it was not safe to utter religious platitudes in your presence. So rescue me from any disposition but gratitude, and give me a will to invite others to the party. Amen.

Wednesday, September 10 — Luke 14:25-34

Jesus has many 'hard sayings' for those who would follow him, but vv.26-27 may well be the *hardest*. This is followed by a pair of parables about counting the high cost of radical discipleship - which, unfortunately for the crowd, is the only deal that Jesus is offering.

- Why do you think Jesus posed the "cost" of following him so starkly? It is still so costly faithfully to follow him today?
- Prayer: Honestly, Lord Christ, you don't seem to ask much of me.
 My life seems close to what I have chosen for myself. Give me the courage to ask: what more would you ask? Amen.

Thursday, September 11 — Matthew 22:1-14

Matthew's Parable of the Wedding Banquet has clear parallels to Luke's – but here, the dignity of the host is preserved, and the images are much darker. Here, we see that human disobedience toward the God who invites is not only tragic, but perilous.

- What does Matthew intend to say about God's Kingdom by this Parable? What does it mean that 'few are chosen?'
- Prayer: Eternal God, I know it is your love for all the world that sent Jesus to us. But I want to be counted among those who answer, to bring you joy as I in turn bring others. Amen.

Friday, September 12 — Titus 3:3-8

A lesser-known letter of Paul to a protégé, <u>Titus</u> is full of practical advice, including how to lead a transformed life that yields a community that transforms those beyond its boundaries. The reader might pay special attention to the way Paul characterizes the saving mission of Jesus.


- Too often we focus on works: "she does good things; he is a good person." But according to Paul, why is mercy essential to what it means "to do what is good?"
- Prayer: Blessed Savior, today your mercy for me is both new and needed. I thank you for it, and with that spirit of gratitude may you empower me to change the world. Amen.

Saturday, September 13 — Matthew 9:9-13

Sometimes Jesus enacted a parable – in real time! As Matthew recounts his own calling by Jesus, we hear the echo Jesus' words: "I desire mercy, not sacrifice." Religion has never been the same since.

- Why did it so deeply offend devout experts in the Law (which was intended by God to make the people holy), that Jesus lodged and ate with people who lived openly in sinful behavior and seamy company? What do you understand Jesus' rebuke to this viewpoint to mean?
- Prayer: Lord Jesus, I want to live in ways that would make you proud. But at times, I recognize that I am judgmental, selfish and small in spirit. In those moments, perhaps I am as close to you as I have been in years. Show me mercy then, and get started with me on what I may become. Amen.
