Monday, October 13 — Luke 5:1-11

As we began our sermon series, we saw Jesus calls his first disciples: Peter, Andrew, James and John, who first respond to his request by helping him teach the crowds. They also make a tremendous catch of fish, but then counterintuitively drop their nets and leave their boats behind to follow Jesus.

- The nautical activity here is enticing: how is life with Jesus like putting out for deep water? Are you "catching people" for Jesus, or more like the many admirers who remain on the shoreline?
- Prayer: Lord Jesus, I have learned your voice, and I take seriously
 what you have to say. I am also quite accustomed to my home port.
 Where would you have me go, and to whom, if I were to take seriously your call for me to launch out and follow you? Amen.

Tuesday, October 14 — Mark 4:35-41

Mark is rather hard on the disciples. Here he recounts that not only are they fearful for their lives, but they are alarmed at Jesus' display of power over wind and wave. John Wesley was likewise terrified at the prospect of being lost at sea, but more deeply troubled at what seemed to him to be a lack of unshakeable faith in a time of crisis.

- How does worry impact your life? How does your faith in a faithful God manifest when you or someone dear becomes seriously ill, or you are struck by grief, or your income is threatened? Does God "show up" in such seasons? How?
- Prayer: Sometimes I have wondered, Lord, where you are when the storm breaks. So it puzzles me that the disciples were frightened to see Jesus tame the waves and wind. I want to know you more, and better, so I can be clear about what I need in times of trial. Which is you. Amen.

Wednesday, October 15 — Ruth 1:1-18, 4:13-18

The Book of Ruth (which commends itself to be read in full!) does not include a formal call by God to the hero, a Moabite (one of the historic enemies of Israel). But Ruth's fierce loyalty to family, her courageous journey to a strange place, and her ultimately making the God of Israel her own are a part of Jesus' lineage, and thus our own salvation history.

- Ruth launches out on a risky trek to an uncertain future. Have there been seasons when your future seemed far less than secure or hopeful? In what did Ruth find the hope she needed? In what (or whom) have you?
- Prayer: Lord Jesus, it is enticing to us that you, the Bread of Life, were born in a town called "House of Bread." Bethlehem was also the place where Ruth found her people and her home. Today I reflect on where "my Bethlehem" is, and what people have become "my people" along my journey with you. Amen.

Thursday, October 16 — Judges 6:11-17, 20-27, 36-40

The call of Gideon (of which our reading is a small part) is replete with humor: while God's plan to rescue the Israelites is good news, Gideon proves cheeky, whiny, and woefully lacking in confidence. He points to his own insignificance and inability to lead God's people, and throws up a host of qualifiers before he will consider answering God's call.

- How do Gideon's objections show a lack of confidence in himself?
 Do they also show a lack of trust in the God who calls?
- Prayer: Lord, how often do I tell myself that I do not have the time, the knowledge, or the ability to speak for you? Is my lack of confidence only in myself? Amen.

Friday, October 17 — Esther 4:1-17, 9:1

You may have heard that <u>Esther</u> is the only Book of the Bible that never mentions God's name. It is also a story of peril and deliverance, based on one woman's courage in a pivotal moment. You may recognize verse 4:14, in which Mordecai makes clear to Esther that a position of influence to help her people may be no accident "for such a time as this."

- In what seasons of life have you sensed a crisis? Do you think that God still can and does call people "for such times as these?" Why not you?
- Prayer: Lord, I am no reigning royal. My sphere of influence is limited, and the injustices around me and beyond me are wide and great. Do you call the likes of me to act in "such a time as this?" Would I respond if you did? Amen.

Saturday, October 18 — John 4:1-42

John loves detailed stories with lots of dialogue. Jesus' encounter with the Samaritan woman at the well is one of these. It lacks a formal call; he does not summon her to "go and fish," after all - he only converses with her. But the woman becomes perhaps the *first successful evangelist*, because she rushes to tell all in her village her (still incomplete but apparently powerful!) testimony as to meeting Jesus.

- What does your testimony as to meeting Jesus include? Have you
 ever uttered it? Does it seem incomplete or lacking? What do you
 think God could do with it, were you to share it?
- Prayer: Lord Jesus, my life is different for coming to know you. I
 need to know you more. But free up my tongue, for there are those
 who know you less. Amen.
