Scripture

1 Samuel 8:1-9, 19-22

When Samuel became old, he made his sons judges over Israel. The name of his firstborn son was Joel, and the name of his second, Abijah; they were judges in Beer-sheba. Yet his sons did not follow in his ways, but turned aside after gain; they took bribes and perverted justice.

Then all the elders of Israel gathered together and came to Samuel at Ramah, and said to him, 'You are old and your sons do not follow in your ways; appoint for us, then, a king to govern us, like other nations.' But the thing displeased Samuel when they said, 'Give us a king to govern us.' Samuel prayed to the Lord, and the Lord said to Samuel, 'Listen to the voice of the people in all that they say to you; for they have not rejected you, but they have rejected me from being king over them. Just as they have done to me, from the day I brought them up out of Egypt to this day, forsaking me and serving other gods, so also they are doing to you. Now then, listen to their voice; only—you shall solemnly warn them, and show them the ways of the king who shall reign over them.'

But the people refused to listen to the voice of Samuel; they said, 'No! but we are determined to have a king over us, so that we also may be like other nations, and that our king may govern us and go out before us and fight our battles.' When Samuel had heard all the words of the people, he repeated them in the ears of the Lord. The Lord said to Samuel, 'Listen to their voice and set a king over them.' Samuel then said to the people of Israel, 'Each of you return home.'

Monday, November 27 — Jeremiah 33:7-16

This week we're going to read how the prophets of the Old Testament promised a kingdom that would be unlike any kingdom the people could imagine. Jeremiah, writing during some of Israel's bleakest moments of exile, described a promise that likely seemed unbelievable to even the most faithful of God's people: an heir of David would be on God's throne forever and would bring about God's promised future.

- Have you ever experienced the depth of hopelessness? If so, where did you turn to find strength to keep going? What are the promises that give you hope for tomorrow.
- Prayer: Faithful God, even when my faith is weakened, I know I can count on you. Thank you for hopeful promises. Help me to trust you more fully every day. Amen.

Tuesday, November 28 — Jeremiah 33:15-22

Through Jeremiah, God promised that the heir of David's throne would "execute justice and righteousness" (Jeremiah 33:15). In Jeremiah's time, this promise probably referred to Temple practices and Israel's political reality. It would have different meaning when Jesus was born, when we believe the promise was ultimately fulfilled. Our world is not all that different. We, too, long for justice and righteousness. We long for the justice and righteous that comes through Jesus.

- What kinds of justice and righteousness do you long for? What kind of justice and righteousness do you think Jesus brings to our world? What kinds of justice and righteousness does Jesus bring to your life?
- Prayer: Righteous God, forgive me when I fail to act with justice and righteousness toward other people. Teach me how to live the life you intend for me and for the world. Amen.

Wednesday, November 29 — Isaiah 11:1-10

Like Jeremiah, Isaiah also looked forward to the day when a righteous branch would come out of David's lineage. (Jesse was David's father. See 1 Samuel 16.) With vivid images, Isaiah describes a new reality, a kingdom that is unlike anything anyone could imagine. In a broken world, these promises seem like an impossible dream. To keep our faith, we need to remember what Jesus told his disciples, "for mortals it is impossible, but not for God; for God all things are possible" (Mark 10:27).

- As you read Isaiah's words, do you think these words were fulfilled in Jesus' life and ministry? Are they being fulfilled in your life today? What can you do to help fulfill these promises?
- Prayer: God of Hope, I sometimes think your promises are unrealistic. Remind me that with you, nothing is impossible. Increase my faith. Help me trust you more fully. Amen.

Thursday, November 30 — Ezekiel 34:17-24

God promises that the heir of David will reign over a kingdom of justice and righteousness. In God's Kingdom, the Good Shepherd will care for all of God's flock and the "fat sheep" will not take advantage of the "lean sheep." God's Kingdom will be unlike any human kingdom that ever existed. There will be no bullying or exploitation of the weak. There will be justice and righteousness among God's people. As Jesus taught us, "many who are first will be last, and the last will be first" (Mark 10:31).

- Are you aware of any situations where you unjustly take advantage of others? Do you hear God calling you to change anything about your life? Will God's words affect the way you celebrate Christmas this year?
- Prayer: God of Light, open my eyes to clearly see the consequences of my actions. Forgive me when I fail and teach me to follow your will. Let your Kingdom come. Amen.

Friday, December 1 — Isaiah 64:1-9

God's Kingdom dream is not only to change the world and change the nature of human relationships, but also to change the hearts and minds of God's people. Like a potter molds and remolds a lump of clay (Isaiah 64:8), God's love and grace is constantly molding and remolding our lives. By God's grace, we are invited to respond to the Gospel's message, "the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news" and follow Jesus (Mark 1:14-20). That's how God changes the world, through the transformed lives of Jesus' disciples — people like us.

- Isaiah's prophecy and Jesus' invitation challenge us to honestly reflect on our lives. How well does your life reflect the teaching and example of Jesus? Do you sense God trying to mold or remold your life? Will you let God change your life?
- Prayer: God of Love and Grace, I know that you want the best for me. I'm ready to respond to your invitation to follow Jesus. I'm ready for you mold and remold my life today. Amen.

Saturday, December 2 — Jeremiah 18:1-4

Like Isaiah, Jeremiah describes God as a potter who wants to rework the vessels of human lives. He reminds us that God can and will change our lives. The human part of God's transformation project is to stay firmly in the center of the potter's wheel. This means we center our lives in the love and grace of God. As a season of spiritual preparation for Christmas, Advent — which begins tomorrow (December 3) — invites us to (re)center our lives in God so that we can be transformed by the birth of Jesus.

- Is the image of a potter reworking a vessel a helpful image for you? Is it scary or is it hopeful? Or both? What do you need to do to stay centered during the Advent season?
- Prayer: Loving God, give me the courage to stay focused on you during the craziness of December. Help me discover, and believe, that in Jesus, a new day is dawning. Amen.


