Scripture Luke 9:28-36 Taehwan Roh (8:30), Ashley Thompson (10:30)

Now about eight days after these sayings Jesus took with him Peter and John and James, and went up on the mountain to pray. And while he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became dazzling white. Suddenly they saw two men, Moses and Elijah, talking to him. They appeared in glory and were speaking of his departure, which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem. Now Peter and his companions were weighed down with sleep; but since they had stayed awake, they saw his glory and the two men who stood with him. Just as they were leaving him, Peter said to Jesus, 'Master, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah'—not knowing what he said. While he was saying this, a cloud came and overshadowed them; and they were terrified as they entered the cloud. Then from the cloud came a voice that said, 'This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!' When the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. And they kept silent and in those days told no one any of the things they had seen.

Monday, February 12 — Luke 9:18-27

In this week's GPS readings from Luke's Gospel, Jesus will "set his face to go to Jerusalem" (Luke 9:51) and we will journey with him and his disciples as we begin to prepare our hearts and minds for Holy Week and Easter. Chapters 9 and 10 (in Luke) invite us to decide for ourselves who we think Jesus is and whether we can trust him with our lives. If we, like Peter, believe that Jesus is "the Messiah of God" (Luke 9:20), then we will have to count the cost of being his disciple.

- Read Luke 9:23-27 once again. What do you think about Jesus' words? What does it mean for you to take up your cross every day and follow Jesus? Do you trust Jesus enough to follow him?
- Prayer: God of Heaven and Earth, thank you for sending Jesus to be your anointed Messiah. Give me the courage I need to trust him with my life every day. Amen.

Tuesday, February 13 — Luke 9:28-36

Luke tells us that eight days after his conversation with Peter and the disciples, he went to the mountaintop, along with Peter and James and John, to pray. While he was praying Jesus was transfigured and Moses and Elijah appeared to talk with Jesus. In response to the disciples' fear and confusion about what they were seeing, a voice from heaven told them that Jesus was God's Chosen Son and that they should "listen to him" (Luke 9:35).

- The Transfiguration story affirms for the disciples that Jesus is the Son of God and that they can trust what he tells them to do. What helps you listen to Jesus and trust him?
- Prayer: Gracious God, I am too often like Jesus' disciples, confused and afraid. Speak to me once again and teach me to listen.
 Help me to trust you and trust Jesus today. Amen.

Wednesday, February 14 — Luke 9:51-62

Today is Ash Wednesday, the first day in the Christian season of Lent. On this day, we consider our mortality and acknowledge our need for God's saving grace. We are invited to observe a holy Lent and allow God to transform our lives. Just as it wasn't easy to follow Jesus during his earthly ministry, it is not easy to follow Jesus today. We have to trust that Jesus knows what he is doing and that following him is worth the risks (to our reputation, to our relationships, to our priorities, ... etc.)

- Can you think of a time in your life when you took a (risky) step of faith? What would it be like for you to take the next (risky) step of faith as a follower of Jesus?
- Prayer: Eternal God, forgive my hesitancy to surrender my life to Jesus and fully commit to being his disciple. Help me take the next step today, however risky it may seem. Amen.

Thursday, February 15 — Luke 10:25-37

On the road to Jerusalem, Jesus is tested by an expert in God's law. He is asked what is essential for eternal life. After he affirms that loving God and loving your neighbor will lead to "life" (Luke 10:28), Jesus is asked one of the most important questions in the whole of the Gospel: "And who is my neighbor?" (Luke 10:29). Jesus responds by telling a story, a story we know as the parable of the Good Samaritan. It is a striking story that turns the idea of "neighbor" on its head.

- What do you think about the parable's lesson, that "the one who showed ... mercy" (Luke 1037) is the one who is obeying God's law? Do you trust Jesus enough to make loving God, loving your neighbor, showing mercy your highest priorities?
- Prayer: God of Mercy, thank you for the teaching and example of Jesus. Thank you for the hard teachings that challenge my priorities. Teach me how to show mercy. Amen.

Friday, February 16 — Luke 10:38-42

The account of Jesus' visit with Martha and Mary hits close to home in our world of busy type-A personalities. Many of us can relate to Martha, busy making sure everything gets done and feeling frustrated at having to do it all by herself. The point of the story is not that we should ignore our long to-do lists, but that we can and should put our priorities in order. In the parable of the Sower (Luke 8:4-8, 11-15), Jesus us warns us about the danger of the "cares" of life (Luke 8:14).

- Think back over this week. Have you made time for what's most important? Have you made time for your relationship with God? Does stopping your "work" long enough to sit with God in prayer seem risky? What needs to change for you to take the next step?
- Prayer: God of the Universe, I am amazed that you know and love me and want to be in a relationship with me. Show me how I can make time to spend with you every day. Amen.

Saturday, February 17 — Luke 12:22-34

The most difficult of all of Jesus' teachings just might be found in to-day's reading: "do not worry ..." Luke 12:22 and Luke 12:29). Jesus' teaching here — and elsewhere in the Gospel — is simple, but it's not easy. Jesus says that the antidote to worry consists of: (1) paying attention to God's goodness; (2) remembering that worrying doesn't change anything; (3) striving for God's Kingdom (living the life that God intends for us to live and helping others do the same); and (4) trusting God. Striving for the Kingdom and trusting God are interdependent. We can't have one without the other.

- What can you do today to increase your ability to trust God? What will you do today to increase your ability to trust God?
- Prayer: Promise-Keeping God, grant me the confidence I need to strive first and foremost for your Kingdom and to trust you with everything else. Help me stop worrying. Amen.
