Monday, April 10 — Matthew 27:50-66

Since some people believed that Jesus didn't really die, Matthew and the other Gospel writers emphasized the bodily death of Jesus. The shocking Good News of Easter depends upon the reality of Good Friday's darkness and Jesus' death. The power of Easter is the power of life over death. It is the greatest power in the universe. It changes our lives. It changes the world.

- Reflect today on the finality of death. Can you feel the depth of emotion that accompanies Good Friday? What would you have experienced if you were there at Calvary 2,000 years ago? How does Good Friday impact the meaning of Easter for you?
- Prayer: God of Love, I struggle to understand the depth of Jesus' suffering and sacrifice. Remind me again that Good Friday sets me free from the power of sin and death. Amen.

Tuesday, April 11 — Matthew 28:1-7

The resurrection of Jesus was so significant that, according to Matthew, it shook the world (Matthew 27:51). It definitely shook the lives of the women who went to the tomb and the disciples who met him in Galilee. It still has the power to shake-up our lives today. The resurrected Jesus still promises to go before us and meet us in the places where we live our lives. He promises to be with us always (Mathew 28:20).

- With the message of Easter fresh in your mind, look for signs that the resurrected Jesus is present in your life today. Where do you see evidence of Jesus' presence? What helps you recognize Jesus' presence in the world today?
- Prayer: Living God, open my eyes so that I might see Jesus today.
 Open my heart and mind to his presence in my life, so that I will grow in confidence and faith. Amen.

Wednesday, April 12 — Matthew 28:8-20

The disciples whom Jesus met in Galilee (as promised in Matthew 26:32 and Matthew 28:7) were given a purpose and a mission to fulfill for the rest of their lives. They were able to fulfill their purpose because they experienced Jesus' resurrection. The great commission given to the disciples in Galilee is also given to Jesus' disciples today. We who have been commissioned will only be able to fulfill this purpose when we have first-hand experience of Jesus' resurrection.

- What do you (really) think about Jesus' resurrection? How have you experienced the resurrection for yourself? What does it mean for you?
- Prayer: Sending God, as I experience the life-changing power of Jesus' resurrection, I hear your commission. I will go where you send me and do what you ask of me. Amen.

Thursday, April 13 — Ephesians 1:15-23

Until Easter, death seemed to have the final word. It was the one part of the human experience that humans could not overcome. Even to-day, human beings are powerless to prevent death. Despite the advances of human achievement, death has not been conquered. Only the power of God can conquer death. That is why resurrection is God's ultimate display of power — the greatest power in the universe. Ephesians 1 says that power is "for us who believe" (verse 19).

- Do you believe that God's resurrection power is available for your life? How is God's resurrection power at work in your life? What can you do today that will allow God to empower you for ministry and service?
- Prayer: Almighty God, thank you for demonstrating your power on Easter Day. Empower me to serve you today. Grant me courage to trust you fully today. Amen.

Friday, April 14 — Romans 6:1-11

One way to summarize the Christian message is that *God raises the dead*. The New Testament promises that what God did for Jesus, God can do for us: *raise us from death to life*. But the Good News includes the possibility that we can experience God's resurrection power before our physical bodies die. The Good News is that when we die to sin, we experience resurrection life through Jesus Christ (Romans 6:10-11).

- Are you able to believe that new life is possible today? Are you willing to let your sinful self die, so that God can raise you to a new life in Christ?
- Prayer: Merciful God, forgive my sins. Forgive my lack of faith.
 Forgive my fear and doubt. Let my sinful self die, so that I might experience new life in Jesus Christ. Amen.

Saturday, April 15 — 2 Corinthians 5:14-21

Easter is a season of hope. The resurrection of Jesus demonstrates the mighty power of God to give life in the face of sin and death. According to 2 Corinthians 5, if anyone is separated from God by sin, they can hope in the promise of new life "in Christ" (2 Corinthians 5:17). There is hope of reconciliation. There is a new creation. That's the Good News.

- What does life "in Christ" look like for you? In what ways are you
 living your life "in Christ" today? How have you been made new by
 the grace, love, and resurrection power of God?
- Prayer: God of Abundant and Eternal Life, fill me with the Spirit of Christ today. I want to be made new. Grant me a fresh start today
 the gift of a new beginning. Amen.


