Monday, July 24 — Genesis 1:1-4a, John 1:1-5

The creation story in Genesis 1 says that, before anything else was spoken into existence, God's first act of creation is to bring light into darkness. This is what God has always done and what God continues to do today. The first chapter of John's Gospel echoes the creation story and affirms that Jesus is the light that shines in the darkness of our lives. The Good News is that the darkness of the world cannot overcome the light of God's glory.

- How have you experienced darkness in your life? How have you experienced God's light?
- Prayer: God of Creation, allow your light to shine brightly and dispel the darkness of the world. Let the light of your Son, Jesus Christ, shine in the darkness of my life. Amen.

Tuesday, July 25 — Isaiah 58:6-14

Isaiah 58:6-14 is one of the Bible's many passages that describe God's desire for justice, compassion, and mercy. Ministries of freeing the oppressed, feeding the hungry, and welcoming the homeless are more pleasing to God than ritual fasting. This does not mean that God rejects our worship, but that God expects us to serve God in both word (acts of worship and devotion) and deed (acts of justice, compassion, and mercy.) God's light shines when we bless others.

- In what ways have you fulfilled the expectations God describes in Isaiah 58? How have your acts of justice, compassion, and mercy strengthened your relationship with God? What act of justice, compassion, or mercy will you perform today?
- Prayer: Gracious God, forgive me for ignoring the cries of hurting people. Grant me the courage I need to answer your call to serve the needs of others. Amen.

Wednesday, July 26 — Isaiah 9:1-2, Matthew 4:12-17

In his introduction to Jesus' ministry, Matthew quotes the prophet Isaiah who promises that God's people will be delivered from oppression and that God's light will shine in their darkness. Matthew's point is that Jesus fulfills the prophet's promise of God's salvation. The larger message is that Jesus is God's answer to the brokenness of the world.

- How has the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus served as light for your life? How has the message of Jesus guided your decisions and your actions – in both good times and bad times?
- Prayer: God of Salvation, thank you for sending Jesus to be light for a world shrouded in darkness. I choose to let his example and his teachings guide my life today. Amen.

Thursday, July 27 — Ephesians 5:8-14

New Testament writers used the image of light and darkness not only to describe the difference Jesus has made in the world, but also to describe the difference Jesus can make in our lives. The light of Christ shines brightly in our lives, revealing our brokenness, our pain, and our sin. It is only when we walk by the light of Jesus Christ that we can clearly see the way forward.

- Use the teaching and example of Jesus to honestly examine the state of your life today. Ask God to help you see yourself clearly. In prayer, confess your sin and your need for God's grace. Give thanks to God for the many blessings you have received.
- Prayer: Merciful God, I confess that too much of my life is lived in darkness. I need your saving grace. Forgive my sin and grant me the new life you offer through Jesus. Amen.

Friday, July 28 — 1 John 1:1-10

The First Letter of John picks up one of the central themes of John's Gospel – that God's light shines through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. It also challenges us to walk in the light of Christ, confess our sins and receive the forgiveness of God. This passage describes the choice facing everyone who has an encounter with Jesus: to walk in the light or continue walking in the darkness.

- Have you chosen to walk in the light of Christ? How have you
 responded to Jesus' invitation to be his disciple? In prayer, renew
 your commitment to be a child of God today.
- Prayer: Eternal God, today I (once again) choose to follow your Son, Jesus, and be his disciple. I will learn from him and trust that he will teach me your ways. Amen.

Saturday, July 29 — John 13:34-35, 1 John 2:7-17

Living as a child of God and a disciple of Jesus Christ requires that we love one another in both word and action. The way we live our lives, the way we behave toward one another, is a reflection of our relationship with God. Jesus insists that our love – in word and action – for one another is the way the world will know that we are his disciples and children of God.

- Reflect on the quality of your human relationships. What does your behavior (what you say and do) reveal about your relationship with God and your commitment to be a follower of Jesus? How well does the character and quality of your human relationships bear witness to Jesus Christ?
- Prayer: God of Love and Light, fill me with your Holy Sprit and teach me your ways so that my life bears witness to your love and grace. Help me live as a child of Light. Amen.
