

[The minister continues this prayer of thanksgiving, concluding:]

And so, with your people on earth and all the company of heaven we praise your name and join their unending hymn:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might,

heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

[The minister continues the prayer, recalling the institution of the Lord's Supper, concluding:] And so, in remembrance of these your mighty acts in Jesus Christ, we offer ourselves in praise and thanksgiving

as a holy and living sacrifice, in union with Christ's offering for us, as we proclaim the mystery of faith.

Christ has died; Christ is risen; Christ will come again.

Pour out your Holy Spirit on us gathered here,

and on these gifts of bread and cup.

Make them be for us the body and blood of Christ,

that we may be for the world the body of Christ, redeemed by his blood.

By your Spirit make us one with Christ,

one with each other, and one in ministry to all the world,

until Christ comes in final victory, and we feast at his heavenly banquet.

Through your Son Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit in your holy Church,

all honor and glory is yours, almighty God, now and forever. Amen.

Grant that we may make our own crossings and passages as we bear to the world the Good News of your saving Grace, in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.





Monday, December 1 — Isaiah 2:1-11

Isaiah paints a breathtaking vision of a future where people from every nation stream toward God's mountain. It's a vision of hope that challenges our present darkness. Instead of trusting in weapons or wealth, God's people are invited to walk in light—to live as if peace were already possible.

But Isaiah also warns against arrogance. The higher we build ourselves, the more we forget who truly reigns. Advent reminds us that true security is found not in power or possessions but in walking humbly with God.

- What "mountains" of pride or self-reliance might God be calling you to lower?
- How could your life become a sign of peace and humility this week?
- Prayer: God of light, lead me away from the shadows of pride. Teach me to walk in your ways of peace and gentleness, so that my life may reflect your coming kingdom. Amen.

Tuesday, December 2 — Psalm 122:1-9

The psalmist rejoices to enter the house of the Lord—a place where gratitude and peace meet. In Advent, we, too, are pilgrims on a journey toward God's presence. Jerusalem means "city of peace," yet peace never happens automatically. It must be prayed for, pursued, and practiced. True worship overflows into relationships marked by reconciliation and care.

When we pray for peace, we are not asking God to do what we will not. We are joining God's work to make peace possible.

- Who around you need your prayer for peace today?
- How might worship shape your actions beyond Sunday?
- Prayer: Faithful God, let my prayer for peace begin with my own heart. Make me an instrument of harmony in my family, church, and world. Amen.

Wednesday, December 3 — Matthew 24:36–51

Jesus teaches that no one knows the hour of his return. The point is not fear but faithfulness. When life feels routine, it's easy to drift into spiritual sleep, forgetting that every day matters.

The faithful servant stays ready not by anxious watching, but by steady service—doing ordinary tasks with extraordinary love. The kingdom arrives not in grand displays, but in small acts of integrity and care.

- What everyday task could become an act of faithfulness for you this week?
- How can you stay spiritually awake amid daily routines?
- Prayer: Ever-present God, help me stay ready through simple faithfulness. Keep my heart attentive and my hands active in love. Amen.

Thursday, December 4 — Romans 12:9-21

Paul describes what it means to live as people of the light: sincere love, patient endurance, generosity, and peace. These are not moral checklists but signs of a heart transformed by grace.

Advent hope is lived out through kindness—feeding the hungry, blessing our enemies, rejoicing with those who rejoice, and weeping with those who weep. When we choose love over resentment, we mirror the light of Christ to a weary world.

- Where do you sense God inviting you to show love that costs something?
- How might you "overcome evil with good" this week?
- Prayer: God of grace, shape my heart to love as Christ loves. Let my life reflect your goodness even in difficult places. Amen.

Friday, December 5 — John 1:1-18

John's prologue declares that the Word became flesh and lived among us. This is the mystery of Advent: the Creator entering creation, the light shining where it is least expected. God's light doesn't erase darkness—it transforms it. When we welcome that light, we discover that grace is not a theory but a person.

In a world that confuses success with worth, John reminds us that divine glory looks like humility, compassion, and truth embodied in Jesus Christ.

- Where have you seen God's light breaking through darkness in your life or community?
- What does it mean for you to "receive" the Word today?
- Prayer: Light of the world, shine in me anew. Let your truth dwell deeply within, and may my life bear witness to your grace. Amen.

Saturday, December 6 — 1 Thessalonians 5:1-11

Paul reminds believers that they are "children of the light." Advent is not about guessing when Christ will return but about living ready every day. To live in the light is to live with courage, encouraging one another, building up faith, and staying sober-minded in hope. The armor of light is not made of metal but of mercy, compassion, and endurance.

The day of the Lord will come, but until then, every sunrise is an invitation to begin again.

- How can you encourage someone else to live in hope this week?
- What would it look like to begin each morning as a new Advent moment?
- Prayer: God of hope, keep me steady in faith and generous in love. Clothe me with your light and teach me to live awake in every season. Amen.
