Grow – Pray – Study

Things I'd like to remember from today's message:

Monday, March 6 — Luke 23:33, 39-43

The image of three crosses is familiar to many Christians. Each of the four Gospel writers tells us that two other men were crucified along with Jesus. But only Luke describes their conversation. We are meant to understand that the two criminals represent two ways to respond to Jesus. It should be clear which of the two criminals makes the right decision.

- The phrase “Remember me . . .” (Luke 23:42), is a request for salvation. (Read Genesis 8:1 and notice how it says that “God remembered Noah” and then saved him from the waters of the flood.) Are you able to ask Jesus to “remember you” today?
- Prayer: *Lord Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom. Save me from the power of sin and death. Grant me the underserved gift of eternal life with you. Amen.*

Tuesday, March 7 — Exodus 2:23-25, 13:3-10

Just as God remembered and saved Noah (in Genesis 8), God remembered and saved Israel in the time of Moses. The Exodus of the Israelites from slavery in Egypt was and is the defining story in the Jewish tradition. It is celebrated every year, as Moses instructed the Israelites to observe the Festival of Unleavened Bread. Remembering is an essential part of our relationship with God. We are expected to “remember” in our prayers and worship how God “remembered” and saved us through the death and resurrection of Jesus.

- Which spiritual disciplines help you remember what God has done for you? What can you do during the season of Lent to remember that you have been saved by God's love and grace?
- Prayer: *God of Eternity, thank you for the witness of Scripture and stories of salvation that strengthen my faith. Help me to remember what you have done through Jesus. Amen.*

Wednesday, March 8 — Luke 5:27-32, Luke 15:1-2

Jesus' offer of salvation to the criminal on the cross was not the first time Jesus offered grace and mercy to a sinner. In fact, Luke tells us that Jesus had a reputation for eating with and associating with outcasts and sinners. Luke also tells us that the religious people were offended that Jesus willingly welcomed and ate with sinners. On the cross Jesus reinforced his true purpose on earth.

- Read Luke 5:31-32 again. How does Jesus fulfill these words on the cross? How does Jesus fulfill these words in your life? How do you as a member of the Body of Christ (the Church) fulfill these words today?
- Prayer: *Loving God, forgive me when I resent your love for outcasts and sinners. Help me see others the way you see them. Help me love others the way you love them. Amen.*

Thursday, March 9 — Romans 5:10-19

One of the effects of Jesus' death is that the curse of sin and death is removed. Through the grace of God, humanity can once again enjoy a relationship with God in Paradise. The promise Jesus makes to the criminal in Luke 23:43 is for everyone — in this life and in the next.

- What would it be like to experience God's Paradise in your life today? In what ways might your life be different? Are you ready to receive the gift of salvation *today*.
- Prayer: *God of Paradise, release me from the paralyzing power of sin and death and set me free to love and serve you more fully — today and always. Amen.*

Friday, March 10 — Luke 19:1-10

Many of us learned about Zacchaeus from a children's song ("Zacchaeus was a wee little man ...") We might have forgotten some of the additional details in the Biblical story: Zacchaeus' great wealth; the grumbling of Zacchaeus' neighbor; Zacchaeus' repentance and salvation (Luke 19:8-9); and the clear statement of Jesus mission, "*the Son of Man came to seek out and to save the lost*" (Luke 19:10). One of the points of the story is that God's grace has the power to change our lives in the present and the future.

- As you look forward to spending eternity in Paradise, how has God's saving grace affected your life in the present. Has God's grace led you to repentance? Do you experience the abundant life that Jesus promises (John 10:10)?
- Prayer: *God of Grace, today I accept the gift of abundant and joy-filled life that comes through your saving grace. Help me live with confidence and faith. Amen.*

Saturday, March 11 — Revelation 2:1-7

The New Testament Book of Revelation ends in chapters 21 and 22 with a detailed vision of the new heaven and the new earth and the glorious new Jerusalem, where the garden (from Genesis 2 and 3) has been restored. It's a vision of Paradise that gives us hope and invites to keep the faith. The message to the Ephesians promises Paradise, not because they are good, but because God is good. We are saved by God's grace, accepted in faith.

- What is preventing you from accepting for yourself the saving grace of God?
- Prayer: *Merciful God, give me the gift of patient endurance and the strength I need to repent of my sin and follow Jesus. Help me let go of everything that hold me back. Amen.*
