And so, brothers and sisters, I could not speak to you as spiritual people, but rather as people of the flesh, as infants in Christ. I fed you with milk, not solid food, for you were not ready for solid food. Even now you are still not ready, for you are still of the flesh. For as long as there is jealousy and quarreling among you, are you not of the flesh, and behaving according to human inclinations? For when one says, "I belong to Paul," and another, "I belong to Apollos," are you not merely human?		
What then is Apollos? What is Paul? Servants through whom you came to believe, as the Lord assigned to each. I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the growth. So neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but only God who gives the growth.

Grow — Pray — Study

Things I'd like to remember from today's message:

Monday, January 17 — Mark 4:1-9

Jesus' parable of the sower contains several lessons for our discipleship, and for the church. The four types of soil describe the variety of human conditions that God's Word finds when the Gospel is shared. It won't all take root, but the seed that finds fertile soil bears a miraculous harvest. It teaches us to till the soil of our lives so that God's Word can grow in us. It also teaches us to keep sharing the Good News and trust that God's Word will grow and bear fruit. That's what God desires — that God's Word grows and bears fruit in our lives, and in the world.

- Take some time today to reflect on Jesus' parable. What kind of soil has God's Word found in you? Is God's Word growing in you? Is God's Word bearing fruit in you?
- Prayer: *Eternal God, thank you for the teaching and example of Jesus. Help me to receive your Word and allow it to grow and bear fruit in my life. Amen.*

Tuesday, January 18 — 1 Corinthians 3:1-9

When the letter to the Corinthians was written, the church in Corinth was facing deep divisions and conflict. It seems that the Corinthians were more focused on, and divided by, their human leadership and allegiances than in the leadership of Jesus. (See 1 Corinthians 1:10-17 for some of the context.) In his response, Paul (the writer) reminds them that both he and Apollos played a role in their development as believers. But he insists that it is *"only God who gives the growth"* (1 Corinthians 3:7).

- We are often tempted to elevate our place in God's Kingdom and our role in God's Kingdom work. How might you resist that temptation? How might you remember that it's *"God who gives the growth"*?
- Prayer: *Merciful God, forgive me for failing to recognize that growing in discipleship is your desire for my life. Help me learn to trust that you will help me grow if I let you. Amen.*

Wednesday, January 19 — Colossians 1:9-14

Growing in discipleship and *"in the knowledge of God,"* (Colossians 1:10) is a central theme in New Testament letters. What's assumed by the writers is that an encounter with the living God in Jesus Christ will change our lives. We will be *"filled with knowledge," "lead lives worthy of the Lord,"* and *"bear fruit in every good work"* (Colossians 1:9-10). This growth is made possible by God's *"glorious power"* (Colossians 1:11).

- God expects that you will be *filled with knowledge, lead a life worthy of Jesus,* and *bear fruit* in your life. Are God's expectations being fulfilled in your life?
- Prayer: *Almighty God, fill me with the resurrection power that was unleashed in the world on Easter. Transform my life. Help me to lead a life worthy of Jesus. Amen.*

Thursday, January 20 — Ephesians 4:11-16

The New Testament is clear that God intends to mold us into *"the measure of the full stature of Christ"* (Ephesians 4:13). The New Testament is also clear that facilitating this growth and maturity is the purpose of the Church, which has been given the necessary gifts to accomplish this purpose. This means that we are not only going to grow in our own discipleship, we are also going to help others do the same, using the gifts we have been given.

- First, reflect on your level of spiritual maturity. Where is God helping you grow? Second, reflect on the gifts you've been given to help others grow in their spiritual maturity. How are you using the gifts God has given you to help others?
- Prayer: *God of Grace, grant me the courage I need to allow you to work in my life. Help me grow in my ability to follow Jesus and live into the fullness of your Kingdom life. Amen.*

Friday, January 21 — Acts 2:37-47

After the Holy Spirit fills Jesus' disciples (Acts 2:1-13), Peter stands and preaches a sermon about Jesus (Acts 2:14-36) that bears a miraculous harvest of converts (Acts 2:41). But that wasn't the end of the Pentecost story. The addition of 3,000 new believers was just the beginning of the Holy Spirit's work. What followed was the formation of the Church. In Acts 2:42-47 we find an outline of the Church's ministry and some of the spiritual disciplines that we still practice today: teaching/learning, spending time in fellowship, breaking bread (Communion), praying, sharing resources, and worshipping God.

- Of the spiritual disciplines listed in Acts 2:42-47, which ones are most meaningful for you? Which ones challenge you? Which ones will be your priority in 2022?
- Prayer: *Loving God, thank you for the Church. Thank you for planting me in the midst of a community of believers that will help me grow in my discipleship. Amen.*

Saturday, January 22 — Ephesians 3:14-21

End this week by spending time with the prayer and benediction that concludes the third chapter of Ephesians. Pray this prayer for yourself. Reflect on the ways this prayer is being answered in your life right now. Notice how the prayer is primarily about allowing God to work in your life. Notice how God is the one who gets the glory. Re-read 1 Corinthians 3:5-7. Remember that in the life of Christian discipleship, it is *"only God who gives the growth"* (1 Corinthians 3:7).

- Are you willing to allow God *"to accomplish abundantly far more than all [you] can ask or imagine"* (Ephesians 3:20) ... in your life?
- Prayer: *God of the Universe, I confess that I all too often fail to believe that your dreams for my life and for the world can be accomplished. Grant me the gift of faith. Amen.*
