THE GREAT THANKSGIVING

The Lord be with you. And also with you.

Lift up your hearts. We lift them up to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Grow — **Pray** — **Study**

Monday, Aug 4 — Luke 12:13-21

The presenting event for Jesus' "Parable of the Rich Fool" is a family squabble: a man in the crowd asks for Jesus to intervene by making a sibling share an inheritance.

- Why does Jesus decline to respond to the man's request for help? How does he (characteristically) "go big" in his reply?
- Prayer: Lord Jesus, we all are preoccupied with life's details. Money management is just one of them. Share with me this week why your focus on this matters. Amen.

Tuesday, Aug 5 — 1 Timothy 6:6-11

1 and 2 Timothy offer strident practical instruction and moral urgency for 2nd-generation Christians in a pagan world. Verse 6:10 is quite often quoted ("For the love of money...") - but very few will know its context.

- Why is contentment an important Christian virtue, according to Paul? And why is the love of money (and all that wealth offers) a peril, in his view?
- Prayer: Lord, almost no one thinks they are rich. But help me to hear such instruction with the awareness that all of us have much! Rescue me from ever becoming so poor that all I would have is my money. Amen.

Wednesday, Aug 6 — Luke 14:25-33

These are among the hardest sayings of Jesus about the commitment required to be one of his disciples – and indeed, it is hard to imagine anybody else putting such words in Jesus' mouth!

- How have we struggled to live out Jesus' teachings about the demanding way of discipleship? How have we capitulated to the world?
- Prayer: Lord Christ, I know that you are no meek and mild Savior. You
 came to confront evil and challenge the world to see God's way as costly,
 but worthy. Help me walk it with you, so that I can listen, and be reminded along the way that I am made new. Amen.

Thursday, Aug 7 — 2 Corinthians 9:6-15

Paul pens this passage after encouraging an offering for those in need in Jerusalem. He calls for the truly joyful, cheerful and freely-given practice of Christian charity – which quite often the Church seems challenged to develop or perhaps to imagine.

- Considering the arc of Paul's own life, how did he exemplify the kind of generosity for which he calls? What exactly enables a person to become both self-sacrificing and joyful?
- Prayer: Jesus, I thank you for the joy that has flowed into and through my life. Today, help me to express that I really do know from Whom this goodness comes. Amen.

Friday, Aug 8 — Matthew 6:19-24

This passage is part of Matthew's presentation of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount, with its extended teaching on the very stark way that uniquely Christian practices stand contrast with the world.

- Are our practices involving money strangely noteworthy, as people, as families, as a church? If so how? If not enough so, what needs to change?
- Prayer: Blessed Savior, I thought your focus on money matters seemed severe. But I now begin to see that your focus is on us and on me; apparently you mean to save us. Amen.

Saturday, Aug 9 — Luke 12:22-34

It is startling how much Jesus has to say (and Luke has to share!) about the connection between placing our trust in finances and the destructive power of anxiety.

- Does it seem that the US, the wealthiest nation the world has ever seen, has overcome anxiety? Or are we awash in it? Why, and what is the solution?
- Prayer: Son of God who walked with us, I need to cover some more miles with you. But I name what I have as belonging to your Father, and myself as belonging to you. Amen.
