Grow — Pray — Study

Things I'd like to remember from today's message:

Monday, May 5 — Exodus 20:1-6

The basic terms of God's covenant with us are (from God's perspective): I will be your God; you will be my people. (See Exodus 6:7, Leviticus 26:12, and Jeremiah 30:22.) From God's perspective, the covenant relationship is based on (God's) steadfast love. From our perspective, the covenant relationship is a response to God's love. It is based on our love for God (with heart, mind, soul, and strength) and our obedience of God's commandments — primarily, but not limited to, our love for our neighbors.

- Think back over your life. When and how have you experienced God's steadfast love? Have you responded to God's steadfast love for you by loving God and keeping God's commandments? How does your love for God and love for your neighbors define the shape of your life?
- Prayer: *Loving God, thank you for making and keeping your promises to me. Give me the strength and courage I need to make and to keep my promises to you. Amen.*

Tuesday, May 6 — Psalm 145:1-21

Psalm 145 celebrates the goodness and greatness of God. There is an element of thanksgiving for what God has done, but the emphasis is on God's character — the person and nature of God. Verses 8 and 9 are the heart of the Psalm: *"The Lord is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love. The Lord is good to all, and his compassion is over all that he has made."* Whatever else we know about God, we can rest in the assurance of God's grace, mercy, compassion, and steadfast love for all of us and for all of creation.

- Do any of God's characteristics trouble you? If so, which ones? Do any of God's characteristics encourage you? Which of God's characteristics are most important to you?
- Prayer: *Gracious God, grant me a sense of assurance that your grace, mercy, love, and compassion will sustain me. Help me experience your grace and mercy every day. Amen.*

Wednesday, May 7 — Jonah 3:10-4:5

The story of Jonah is about God's willingness to offer second chances to Jonah and to the city of Nineveh. In Jonah 1:1-3, God called Jonah with the intent to send him to Ninevah and call the city to repentance. In response to God's call, Jonah ran away. Ultimately, he couldn't escape God's presence and eventually did what God commanded (in Jonah 3:1-5). Then, when Nineveh repented and God did not destroy it, Jonah became angry with God. He knew that God would show grace and mercy and steadfast love. He knew that God would keep God's promises, but he didn't like it.

- Have you ever been angry with God? Was it because of something God did? Or was it because of something God didn't do?
- Prayer: *Merciful God, today I surrender everything to you, including my anger. Calm my spirit. Teach me how to trust that you will do what's best for me and for others. Amen.*

Thursday, May 8 — Jonah 4:5-11

The Book of Jonah ends with a conversation between Jonah and God about a bush and about the city of Nineveh. God's message to Jonah was framed in the form of a question: if Jonah was so concerned about something as trivial as a bush, shouldn't God be even more concerned about the people of Nineveh? The entire story of Jonah is intended to hold a mirror to our reluctance to answer God's call and our resistance to God's steadfast love, grace, and forgiveness.

- What kind of relationship do you have with God's love and God's forgiveness? Do you ever feel the way Jonah felt? Does God's love and forgiveness ever bother you? Does God ever love and forgive the "wrong" people?
- Prayer: *Eternal God, thank you for your love and forgiveness. Forgive me when I selfishly and judgmentally refuse to accept that you offer your love and grace to everyone. Amen.*

Friday, May 9 — Luke 13:22-30

Some of Jesus' words are difficult to understand. As he made his way to Jerusalem, he was asked about salvation — about who will be saved. His answer was troubling to many of his hearers then, and it's troubling to many hearers today. He said that some people who expect to enter God's Kingdom will not, and that people from the four corners of the earth will be welcomed. What we discover as we read Luke's account of Jesus' life and ministry is that Jesus (and God) cares deeply about people who are the least, last, lost, and left out in the world.

- What do you think about Jesus' message? How does it make you feel? Can you accept the breadth and depth of God's grace?
- Prayer: *Heavenly Father, thank you for Jesus and for the gift of salvation. Thank you for your amazing gift of grace. Today I choose to follow him, trust him, and obey him. Amen.*

Saturday, May 10 — Acts 10:34-48

Peter, who was one of Jesus' disciples and a leader of the early church, was led by God to have an encounter with a man named Cornelius (Acts 10:1-33). Cornelius was a Roman centurion, which means he was a Gentile — someone who was not an Israelite and who was assumed (by Peter) to be outside the reach of God's grace. However, God, through the Holy Spirit, led Peter to understand that Gentiles like Cornelius could also be God's people, and could be saved from the power of sin and death by God's grace, through faith in Jesus Christ. This was a turning point in Peter's life and ministry. It was a turning point for the early church as well.

- Are you willing to consider the possibility that God, through the Holy Spirit, is leading you to a new understanding about the scope and the power of God's grace? What is God teaching you today?
- Prayer: *Almighty God, open my eyes to see and my ears to hear once again your message of love and grace. Fill me with your Spirit and teach me what I need to know. Amen.*
