Scripture Matthew 2:1-12 Neil Hough

In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, asking, 'Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage.' When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him; and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born. They told him, 'In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet:

"And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who is to shepherd my people Israel."

Then Herod secretly called for the wise men and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, 'Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage.' When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure-chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.

Monday, January 2 — Jeremiah 31:31-34

The beginning of a new year is a wonderful time for us to reflect on our relationship with God. As we read this passage from Jeremiah, we are reminded that God is good and that we can live with trust and obedience. Despite our many failures, we can live with the assurance of God's love and grace. The gift of a new year offers us the gift of a fresh start as God's children.

- Begin this year by spending time reflecting on your relationship with God. What would you like to stay the same? What would you like to improve? What might you do in the next 12 months to strengthen your relationship with God?
- Prayer: Eternal God, grant me wisdom to look honestly at my relationship with you. Forgive me for the ways I fail to trust and obey you. Grant me the gift of a fresh start. Amen.

Tuesday, January 3 — Isaiah 60:1-6

In the darkest days of the year, the Church's celebration of Christmas is a reminder that God's light is still shining in the world and that God's light breaks the power of darkness – the power of sin and death. Just like Israel was to be a light for the world (Isaiah 42:6 and Isaiah 49:6), so are disciples of Jesus (Matthew 5:14). When we experience the light of Christ at Christmas, we are supposed to let it shine in our lives as a beacon to others.

- How brightly does the light of Christ shine in your life? What might you do this year to let God's light shine more brightly through your words and actions?
- Prayer: Light of the World, let your light shine in and through me.
 Transform my words and actions so that I will reflect the love and grace of Jesus every day of my life. Amen.

Wednesday, January 4 — Matthew 2:1-12

Epiphany (January 6) is not only the twelfth day of Christmas, it is the day set aside for celebrating the visit of the Magi to the holy family. Matthew intentionally contrasts the worship of the Magi with the deception of Herod (see also Matthew 2:13-18). It is the Magi from a foreign land who show us how to worship the newborn King. Sometimes we are too much like Herod. We know that the birth of Jesus changes everything, but we don't welcome the changes Jesus brings.

- How has the birth of Jesus impacted your life? How have you responded to the birth of Jesus? How do you pay him homage?
- Prayer: Gracious God, thank you for the best gift I have ever received, the gift of Jesus. In response I will offer him my gifts and worship him every day in word and deed. Amen.

Thursday, January 5 — 2 Corinthians 5:16-20

The new life that God offers followers of Jesus is a gift, not something that we accomplish by good works or by the strength of our own will-power. However, receiving the gift of new life in Christ Jesus does not mean that we have no responsibility or that we are not expected to respond. What we discover is that when we are saved by God's grace through faith (see Ephesians 2:8-10) we become ambassadors for Christ. We are Christ's representatives in the world around us.

- Have you received the gift of new life through Jesus Christ? How are you serving as Jesus' ambassador in the world around you?
- Prayer: God of Grace and Peace, in response to your gift of new life in Christ Jesus, I promise to serve as your ambassador in the world around me – today and always. Amen.

Friday, January 6 — 1 John 2:7-11

When we become new creations through Jesus Christ (see 2 Corinthians 5:17), we receive a new commandment not only to love God with our heart, mind, soul, and strength, but also to love our neighbors as ourselves. John is very clear that when we have received the gift of salvation, it will reflect in our words and our actions. We cannot say that we love God and still hate one another.

- Consider the relationship between your words and your actions. Is your commitment to Jesus reflected in your actions? How might God be calling you to grow in your discipleship this year?
- Prayer: Almighty God, forgive me for the ways I fail to obey your commandments and live my life according the example of Jesus. Help me grow in my discipleship today. Amen.

Saturday, January 7 — John 1:35-43

The life of discipleship is an adventure that begins when we respond to Jesus' invitation to follow where he leads us. He does not give us every detail about the journey ahead of us. Instead, he asks us to trust him and take the next step in confidence and faith. When the disciples asked Jesus where he was going and where he was staying, he simply answered, "Come and see" (John 1:39). This is the same invitation Jesus offers to us today.

- How have you responded to Jesus' invitation follow him? What will help you trust Jesus enough to go wherever he leads you?
- Prayer: Merciful God, thank you for the wonderful gift of Jesus and for the invitation to be his follower. Grant me the courage I need to follow wherever he leads me. Amen.
