Grow — Pray — Study

Things I'd like to remember from today's message:

Monday, November 1 — Hebrews 12:1-4

The Church celebrates All Saints' Day every year on November 1. It is the day we remember and thank God for the members of God's Church who have died in the past 12 months. (Remember: we are all saints, not because we are good, but because God is good.) On All Saints' Day we are reminded that "we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses," (Hebrews 12:1) and that the people who have gone before us have impacted our lives. The "cloud of witnesses" inspires us to keep the faith and run the race of discipleship that is set before us. (Note: Trinity UMC will celebrate All Saints' Day in worship on November 7.)

- Spend time today in prayerful thanksgiving for the people — living or dead — who have impacted your life. Ask God to help you impact the lives of others through your time, your talent, and your treasures.
- Prayer: *Eternal God, thank you for the many witnesses who have impacted my life. Grant them your grace and peace. Use me to impact the lives of others today. Amen.*

Tuesday, November 2 — Matthew 13:44-46

The two parables in Matthew 13:44-46 are about people who found treasures that were so valuable that they were willing to sell everything to get them. Jesus' message is clear: God's Kingdom is this surpassingly invaluable treasure. The Good News of God's Kingdom calls for the commitment of our whole life — everything that we are and everything that we have — our time, our possessions, and even our money. Following Jesus (entering the Kingdom) requires that we be willing to give everything to God.

- How much is the Kingdom of God worth to you? Would you be willing to give up everything to follow Jesus? What is keeping you from giving your whole life to God?
- Prayer: *Gracious God, thank you for helping me discover the treasure that is your eternal Kingdom. Let your Kingdom come, and your will be done, in my life today. Amen.*

Wednesday, November 3 — Deuteronomy 15:7-11

One thing we know about God is that God uses people like us to help people in need. Even though we give to God through the Church as an act of obedience and a response to God's blessings in our lives, we also know that God uses our generosity to bless others. In other words, God uses us to answer the prayers of people who are calling to God for help in times of pain, suffering, and distress. Deuteronomy 15:11 is clear that, as God's people, we are expected to help our poor and needy neighbors.

- In what ways does the church respond to the needs of its poor and needy neighbors? In what ways do you participate in the ministries of the church that help people in need?
- Prayer: *God of Love, too often I ignore the needs of the people around me and think only of myself. Open my eyes so that I can see and help my poor and needy neighbors. Amen.*

Thursday, November 4 — Deuteronomy 26:1-15

The Old Testament book of Deuteronomy describes the covenant between God and the people of Israel. As God's people, we see ourselves in this story as the people God has blessed so that we can be a blessing to the world. In the 26th chapter, we are reminded that when we know ourselves to be blessed by God and saved by God's grace through Jesus Christ, we must return to God the first fruits — the tithe — of all that we have received. We are also reminded that God uses our tithes to bless "the aliens, the orphans, and the widows" (Deuteronomy 26:12).

- What helps you remember and be thankful for the blessings you have received? Which portions of God's blessings do you return to God, the first fruits or what's left over?
- Prayer: *God of Grace, thank you for the gift of salvation through Jesus Christ. Grant me the courage I need to return the first fruits of your blessings back to you. Amen.*

Friday, November 5 — 2 Corinthians 8:1-14

In the apostle Paul's second letter to the Corinthians he reminds them about the collection he is receiving for the Church in Jerusalem (see 1 Corinthians 16:1-4 and Galatians 2:1-10) and uses the collection as an opportunity to teach them about generosity. He says that generosity is a tangible sign of their response to God's grace and that they should give according to their means.

- What does your level of generosity say about your response to God's grace? What does your generosity say about your faith, your trust in God's promises, and your love for God?
- Prayer: *Almighty God, thank you for the abundance of blessings that I enjoy every day. Teach me how to be generous and excel in my response to your grace. Amen.*

Saturday, November 6 — 2 Corinthians 9:10-15

The final section of Paul's appeal to the Corinthians reminds them that they will be blessed by their generosity. This doesn't necessarily mean that they will be financially rewarded, but that their relationship with God (and with others) will be transformed. Paul insists that generosity is one of the ways we grow in our faith and nurture our relationship with God. Generosity is a vitally important spiritual discipline.

- Do you believe that generosity is a spiritual discipline? In what ways have your acts of generosity nurtured your relationship with God? What kinds of blessings have you received when you have generously blessed others?
- Prayer: *Generous God, I am grateful that you held nothing back when you sent Jesus to be my Savior. Transform my life through the spiritual discipline of generosity. Amen.*


