Grow — Pray — Study

Things I'd like to remember from today's message:	
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Monday, April 17 — Genesis 1:26-31, Psalm 8

Our relationship with God begins when we encounter the God who is Lord of the universe — and discover how much God loves us. Many of the Psalms, including Psalm 8, describe not only the majesty of God, but God's love for humankind and God's desire to be in relationship with humankind.

- Begin this week by listing the attributes of God. What do your experiences tell you about God? How would you describe God to someone who has never read the Bible? How would you describe your relationship to God?
- Prayer: God of Creation, remind me again today of your majesty as Creator and Lord of the universe. Remind me of your steadfast love for me and for the world. Amen.

Tuesday, April 18 — Psalm 84, Matthew 6:26, Matthew 10:29-31

Today, consider what it means that the Lord of the universe, the God of heaven and earth, knows you, loves you, and cares for you. Every single person is a person of value, known and loved by God — including you. According to Jesus, the fact that God intimately knows and loves you means that you don't have to be afraid. It means God will take care of you, no matter your life situation or circumstances.

- What does it mean that God knows all about you, down to the last hair on your head? Is that comforting? Or is it unsettling? How does the nature of God affect your relationship with God?
- Prayer: Almighty God, thank you for the promises of Scripture. Forgive me when I forget your promises and fail to be aware of your constant presence. Amen.

Wednesday, April 19 — Hosea 11:1-4, 8-9, Luke 15:11-32

Both the prophet Hosea and Jesus use the analogy of parents and children to describe the relationship between God and humankind. Their point is that God loves us the way a good parent loves their children. In fact, Jesus says that God loves us even when we wander away. And God rejoices when we return. He says there is a party in heaven when lost children are found.

- Think about the characteristics of the best human parents. What do these characteristics teach you about God (who is exponentially better than any human parent)?
- Prayer: Heavenly Father, thank you for loving me, especially when I wander away and turn away from you. Reveal your mercy and grace to me once again. Amen.

Thursday, April 20 — Romans 8:14-17, Galatians 3:26-4:7

In more than one of his letters, the apostle Paul describes the Godhuman relationship as one of adoption. He says that through Christ, God has adopted us as children of God. We are, by God's grace, heirs of the Kingdom, joint heirs with Christ. This means we enjoy the promises of Kingdom-life on earth and in heaven, but it also means that we share in Kingdom responsibilities. This is part of God's covenant with us.

- What Kingdom promises do you, as an adopted child of God, enjoy? To what do you look forward? What Kingdom responsibilities do you have, as a child of God and citizen of the Kingdom?
- Prayer: Eternal God, forgive me when I forget that I am your child and represent your family in the world. Help me remember who I am and whose I am. Amen.

Friday, April 21 — John 15:1-11

The Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments are clear, God desires to be in relationship with every human being. In Jesus, God has bridged the gap caused by human sin and repaired broken God-human relationships. But more than that, according to Jesus, God desires not only that we accept God's grace, but also that we permanently abide in Jesus, so that our lives will bear good fruit of love and obedience and justice.

- In what ways do you abide in Jesus? How do you do your part to maintain your relationship with God? How do you know when you've wandered away from God?
- Prayer: God of Love, I long to be in relationship with you through your Son, Jesus Christ. Give me the courage I need to abide in you, and in your love, at all times. Amen.

Saturday, April 22 — Luke 11:1-4, Romans 8:24-27

There are many ways to establish, maintain, and deepen our relationship with God. Worship, Bible reading and study, fasting, silence, and solitude are just a few of the traditional spiritual disciplines. However, prayer is the primary way we connect with God. God is waiting to be in relationship with us, and prayer is an essential way to open the Godhuman communication channel.

- How would you characterize your prayer-life today? What changes might you make, so that your relationship with God is deepened? Is God calling you to grow in your faith through prayer?
- Prayer: Listening God, through the words and example of Jesus, teach me how you want me to pray today. Let your Spirit pray in and through me when I have no words. Amen.



Sermon Series: You and Me: Nurturing the Relationships that Matter Most

Our lives are lived in the middle of intersecting circles of relationships: with God, with friends and neighbors, with colleagues and co-workers, with spouses and significant others, and with parents and children. These relationships are a gift from God and the source of many blessings in our lives. But they are also the source of much pain through conflict, disappointment and hurt feelings. Starting on April 16, we'll look at what the Bible says about these relationships. We'll discover how our relationship with God affects our human relationships and what we can do to strengthen the most important relationships in our lives. Focusing on our own lives (what we can control, not on our desire to change others) we'll learn how to be better children of God, better friends, better workers, better spouses/partners, and better parents or children.
